**SUBJECT:** Fiscal Note for HB 2754 by House Committee on Judiciary


In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2754 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Under current law, counties are required to do a sanitary inspection of schools in the fall and conduct additional inspections as necessary to protect the public health of the students at the school. HB 2754 would allow counties to exempt themselves from conducting school sanitary inspections.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment states enactment of the bill would not have a fiscal effect on agency operations.

The Kansas Association of Counties states enactment of the bill could reduce duties for public health officials. The Kansas Association of School Boards indicate if the bill is enacted, there would be no fiscal effect on school districts. The League of Kansas Municipalities states the bill's enactment would not have a fiscal effect on cities.
