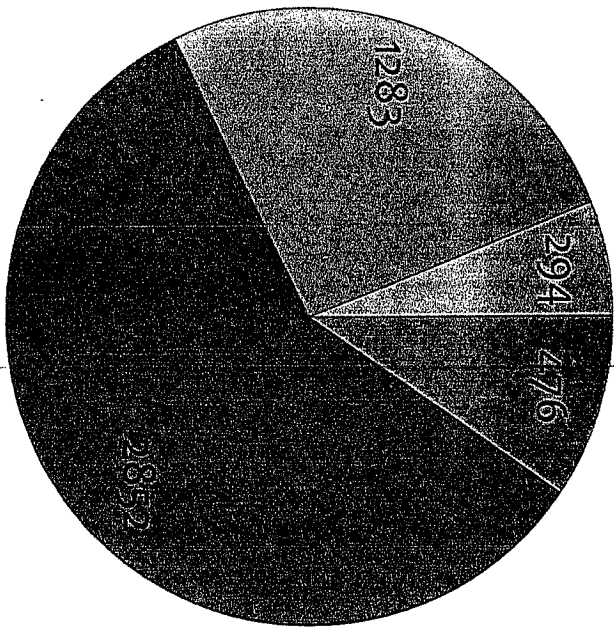

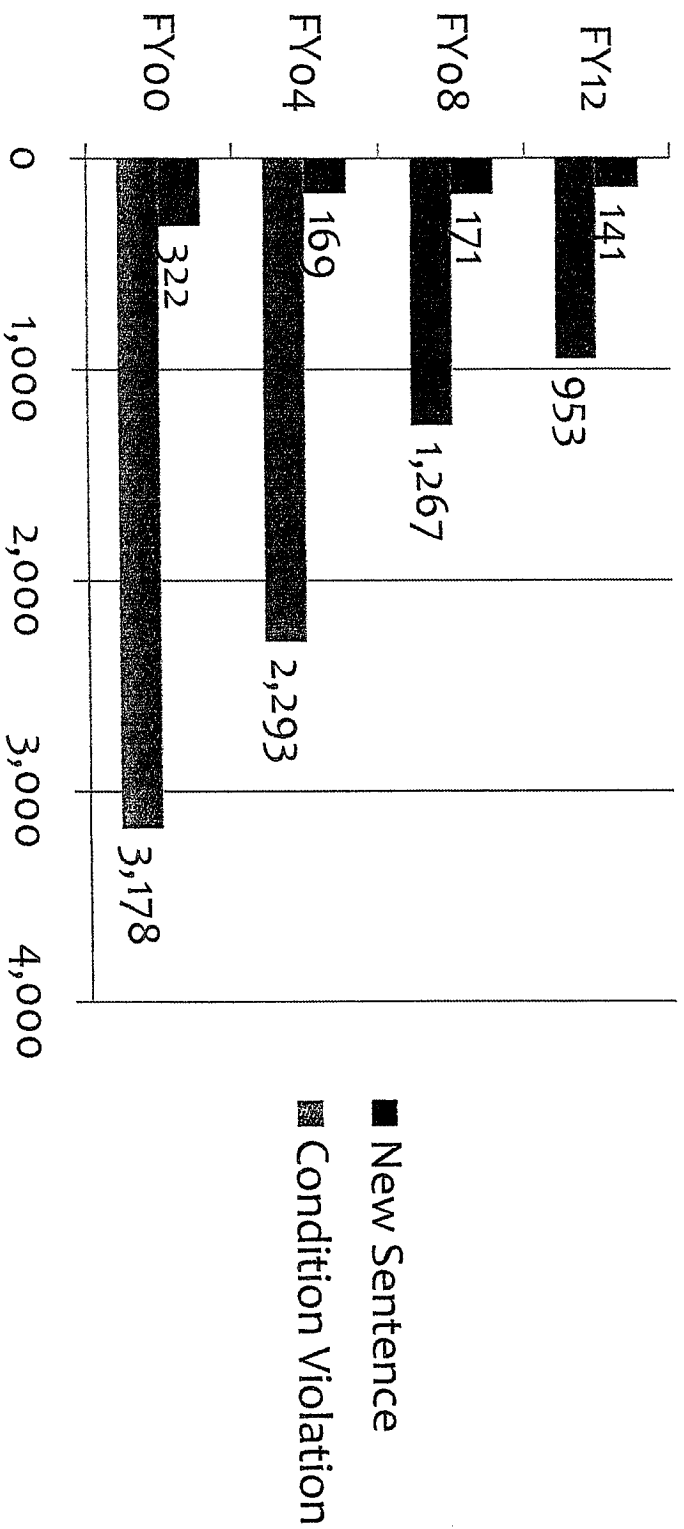
Supervision and Case Management Tools

- ✓ Release Planning
- ✓ Case Management
- ✓ Level of Services Inventory – Revised (LSI-R)
- ✓ Motivational Interviewing
- ✓ Specialized Caseloads (mental health, high risk, sex offender)
- ✓ GPS Monitoring
- ✓ Use of Mentors
- ✓ Referral for Services (substance abuse, mental health, etc.)
- ✓ Sex Offender Treatment contract
- ✓ Cognitive Behavioral programming

Interstate Compact - Overview

The Interstate Compact for Adult Offender Supervision is mandated by federal and state law.

- ✓ Principle of controlled movement and continuous supervision for community safety.
- ✓ Utilizes a national web-based database.
- ✓ KDOC staff track all supervised offenders coming into Kansas for supervision and transferring from Kansas.

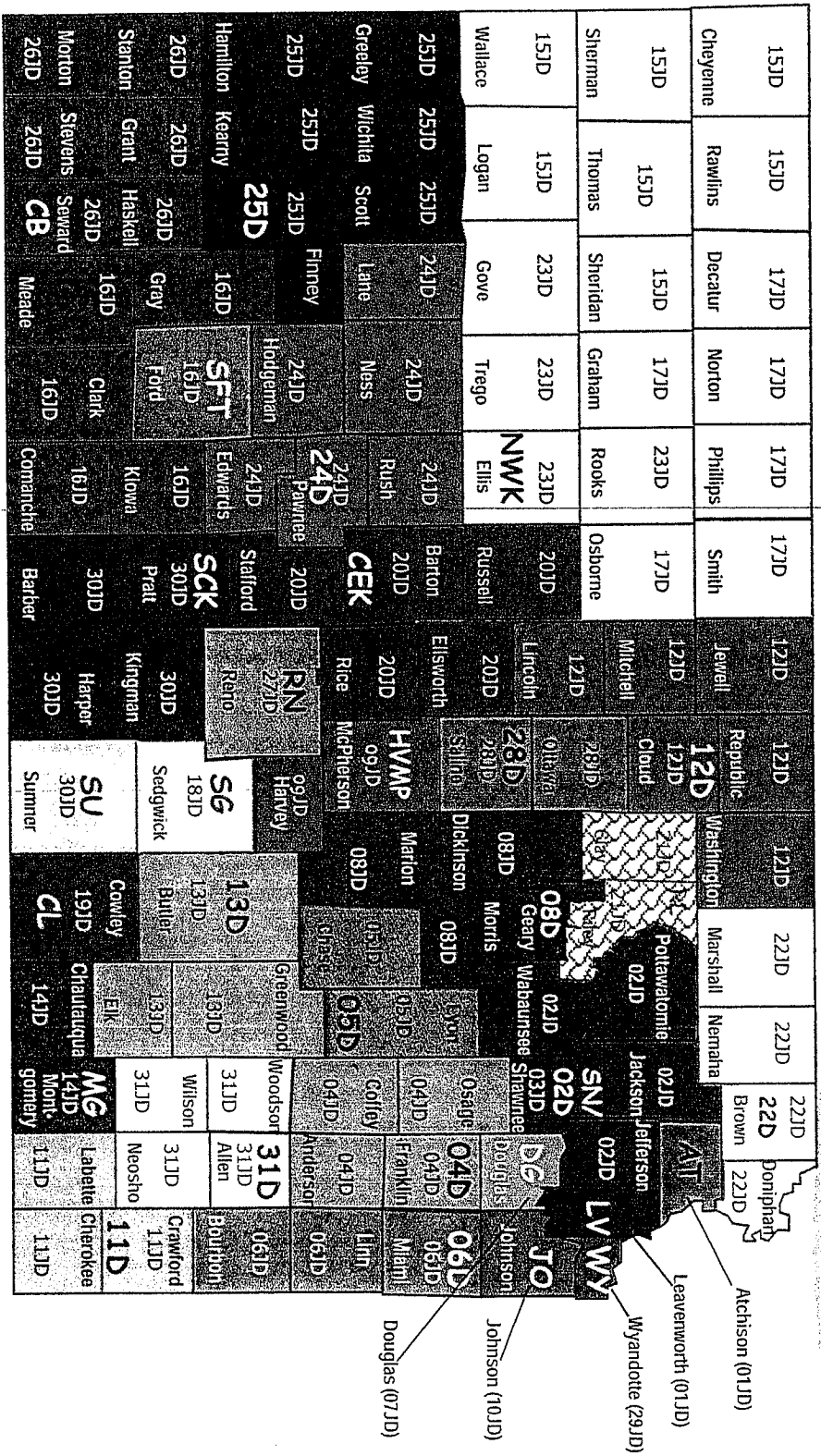
Community Corrections – Overview

Community Corrections Act requires each of the 105 counties to participate

- ✓ 31 Judicial Districts – 30 programs
- ✓ Intensive Supervised Probation (ISP)
- ✓ Act designed to divert offenders from state correctional facilities
- ✓ State provides funding, oversight and technical assistance to local programs

Kansas Community Connections Act Agencies

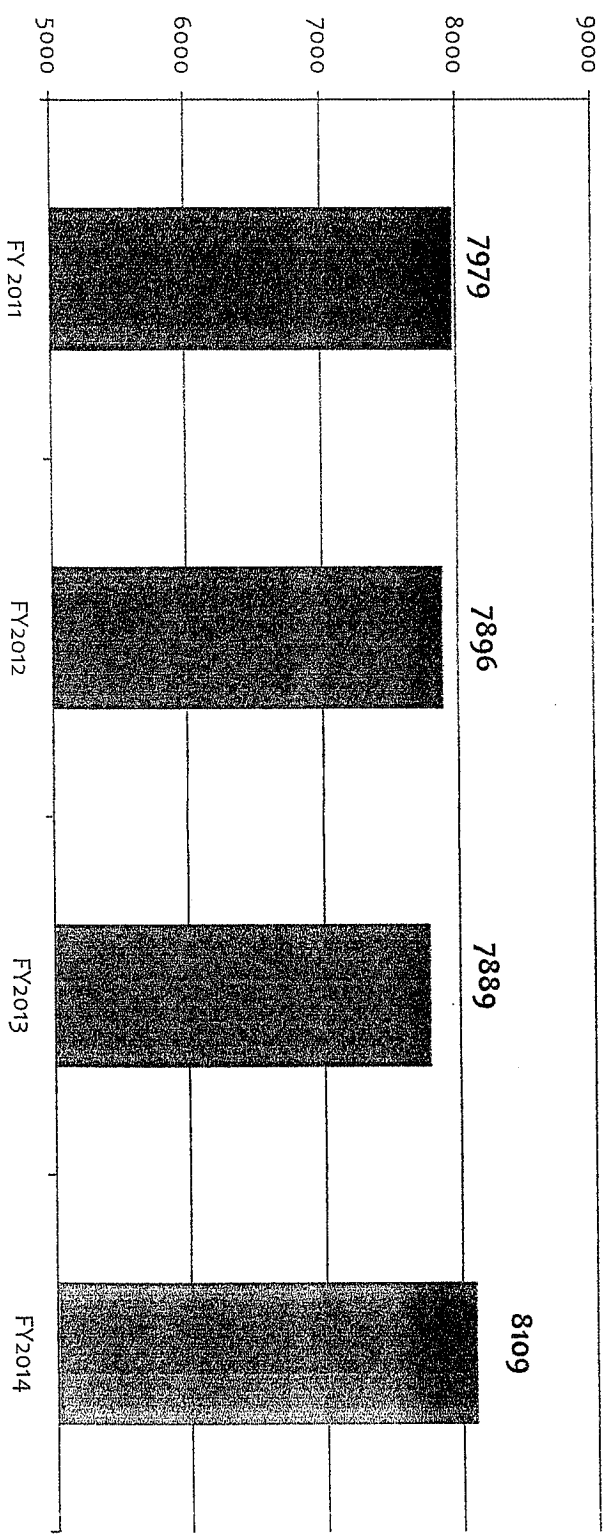
Agency Abbreviations Are Located on Sponsoring Counties

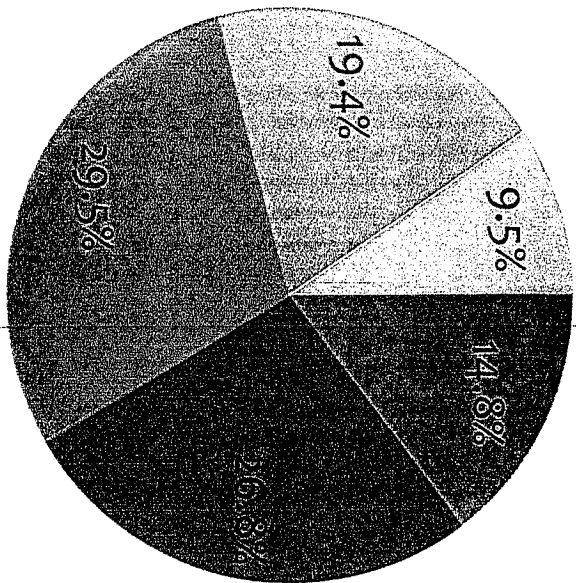
Community Corrections ADP

Supervision Levels

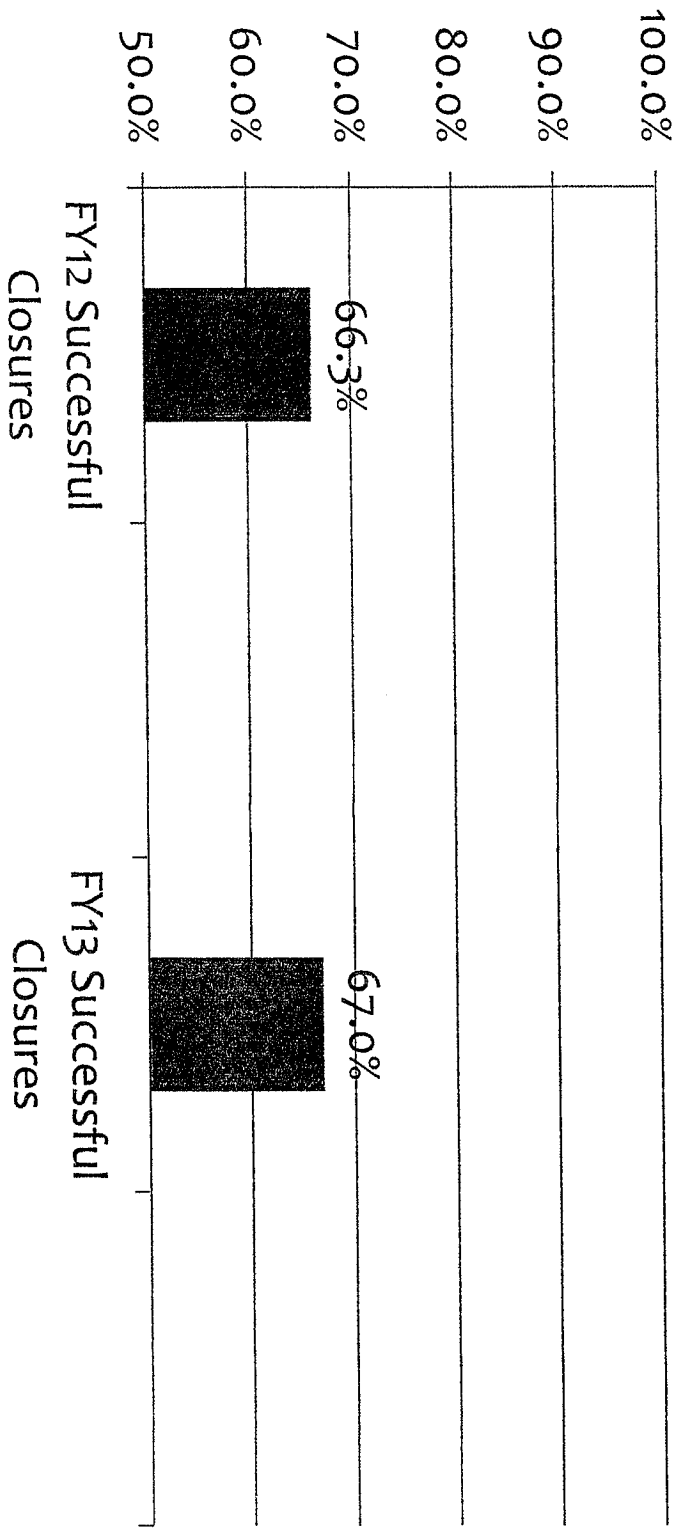
(based most recent LSI-R assessment)
