Representatives Highberger, Jennings, Kuether, Becker, Pauls, Moxley, Finney, Gonzalez and Finch had comments about the changes to the Juvenile Justice system with this reform in the state of Kansas.

Representative Highberger thanked Representative Finch, Representative Jennings, and former Chairman Rubin for all their hard work on this bill.

Representative Jennings thanked the Workgroup that spent a lot time working through the complexities of our Juvenile Justice System. He stated he appreciated the efforts of former Chairman Rubin who tried to work through the process as well and he donated a significant amount of his own time.

Representative Becker stated considering the effort that former Chairman Rubin put into this issue and the passion he had for SB367, he was personally upset that Representative Rubin is not present at this table when we take this vote. He said Representative Rubin was not only his child but the product of a lot of people but you could see the passion he had for this. Yesterday, was a most upsetting day when it comes to **SB367**. He felt compelled to make these remarks.

Representative Pauls stated she echoed the sentiments Representative Becker made. She stated she thinks all of us feels this way. There was a lot of time involved, and she said she appreciated the efforts Representative Finch put in to make the amendments to resolve some of the conflicts. She, also, wanted to thank Pew for all their involvement.

Representative Moxley wanted thank the Committee that have guided him. He stated he had great respect for them.

Representative Finney wanted to commend Representative Rubin, Deputy Secretary Williams, Senator Smith and the Pew Charitable Trusts that did an outstanding job of bringing this to the Kansas Legislature.

Chairman Gonzalez stated this is a great Committee, probably one the better Committees he has served on in the last six years. He said it is beyond a Committee but it is a team. We have been good teamwork. He thanked Representative Rubin for all the leadership he provided to him over the years.

Representative Finch wanted to say they owed debt to Representative Rubin, the members of the Workgroup, Pew, the judges and prosecutors, and all the others that give their work to this process. He said Senator Smith was a guiding light.
