1 2	AN ACT concerning school districts; relating to screenings for dyslexia and related disorders.
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4	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
5	Section 1. (a) On or before July 1, 2019, the state board of education
6	shall develop rules and regulations for the appropriate screening of
7	students for dyslexia and related disorders. Such rules and regulations shall
8 9	include, but are not limited to:

14	(b) Beginning in school year 2019-2020, each school district shall
16	conduct appropriate screenings of students for dyslexia and related
17	disorders. Such screenings shall be conducted in accordance with guidance
18	promulgated by the state board of education under subsection (a). In the
19	event a screening indicates a student may have dyslexia or a related
20	disorder, the school district shall notify the parent or legal guardian of such
21	student. Such notice may include a recommendation that the student be
22	evaluated by a licensed physician, psychologist or psychiatrist.
23	(c) If a student has been diagnosed with dyslexia or a related disorder,
24	the parent or legal guardian of such student may request an evaluation of
25	such student for an individualized education program (IEP), 504 plan or
26	other educational plan. Such request shall include a written statement from
27	a licensed physician, psychologist or psychiatrist stating that the student
28	has been diagnosed with dyslexia or a related disorder. Upon receipt of any
29	such request, the school district shall conduct the appropriate evaluation
30	for an IEP, 504 or other educational plan in accordance with federal and
31	state law.
32	(d) For purposes of this section:
33	(1) "Dyslexia" means a specific learning disability that is
34	neurobiological in origin, and that is characterized by difficulties with
35	accurate or fluent word recognition and by poor spelling and decoding

accurate or fluent word recognition and by poor spelling and decoding abilities. The term "dyslexia" includes: (1) Those difficulties that typically **Comment [A1]:** The State Board has already developed this regulation. It is located at K.A.R. 91-40-11.

Comment [A2]: The State Board has already developed regulations on this topic. They are located at K.A.R. 91-40-1(lll), 91-40-1(ccc), 91-40-1(kkk), 91-40-1(ttt), and K.A.R. 91-40-1(z).

Comment [A3]: This has been occurring for decades. When evaluating students districts must follow K.A.R. 91-40-9 to -11.

Comment [A4]: This word is confusing because Section 1 would require the State Board to develop rules and regulations. Regulations are law, not guidance.

Comment [A5]: K.A.R. 91-40-7 requires district to conduct "child find" activities, "identify, locate, and evaluate." A district does not have to, and in some circumstances cannot, wait for a parent request to evaluate. K.A.R. 91-40-7(c)(3) permits a parent to request a special education evaluation at any time. The parent does not have to wait for an outside diagnosis.
