- (d) The state board of education shall designate one of the members on dyslexia. The chairperson shall call an organizational meeting of the task force on or before July 15, 2018. At such organizational meeting, the force. - (e) The task force may meet at any time and at any place within the state on the call of the chairperson. A quorum of the task force shall be nine members. All actions of the task force shall be by motion adopted by a majority of those members present when there is a quorum.
- If approved by the legislative coordinating council, members of the task force attending meetings authorized by the task force shall be paid amounts for expenses, mileage and subsistence as provided in K.S.A. 75-3223(e), and amendments thereto.
