SENATE FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS AND INSURANCE

TESTIMONY ON SB 267

January 17, 2018

Chairman and Members of the Committee:

I am Clark Shultz, Assistant Commissioner of Insurance for the Kansas Insurance Department. Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of SB 267.

SB 267 proposes to amend K.S.A. 40-2c01, which concerns a standard regulatory tool referred to as risk-based capital (“RBC”). The goal of RBC laws is to ensure each Kansas domestic company has the required amount of capital needed to support its overall business operations in consideration of its size and risk profile.

The amendment updates the RBC Instructions, which instruct companies how to calculate and report RBC, to the current version. The amendment merely replaces “2016” with “2017” in the definition for “RBC Instructions.” Implementing the RBC Instructions is a national accreditation standard. A similar date change amendment has been made each year since 2009.

For these reasons, we ask the Committee to recommend SB 267 favorable for passage.
