SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 102 by Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 102 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 102 would allow the governing body of any county to remove or abate all nuisances from any lot or parcel of ground within the unincorporated area of the county. The bill would outline the process counties must follow when seeking to remove or abate nuisances from private properties. SB 102 would also give county governing bodies the ability to remove and abate vehicles deemed to be a nuisance. The Department of Revenue would be involved in the process of transferring ownership of abated vehicles.

The Kansas Association of Counties and the League of Kansas Municipalities indicate the bill would not have a fiscal effect on Kansas counties or Kansas Cities. The Department of Revenue indicates that compliance with the bill would require one-time expenditures of \$2,610 from the State General Fund in FY 2018 and includes \$200 for policy and procedure development, \$650 for design and development work, \$1,300 for writing and testing test scripts

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and \$460 for user acceptance testing. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 102 is not reflected in *The FY 2018 Governor's Budget Report*.
