## **HOUSE BILL No. 2029**

AN ACT concerning public health; relating to cannabidiol investigational products; regulation.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) As used in this section, unless the context requires otherwise:

- (1) "Cannabidiol" or "cbd" means a compound derived from the cannabis plant that is devoid of psychoactive activity.
  - (2) "Department" means the department of health and environment.
- (3) "Investigational product" means a pharmaceutical form of an active ingredient or placebo being tested or used as a reference in a clinical trial, including a product with a marketing authorization when used in a way different from the approved form, or when used for an unapproved indication, or when used to gain further information about an approved use.
- (b) If a cannabidiol investigational product that is newly approved as a prescription medication pursuant to 21 U.S.C. § 360bb and 21 U.S.C. § 355 is controlled or decontrolled under a federal interim final rule issued pursuant to 21 U.S.C. § 811(j), then similar control or decontrol of the cannabidiol investigational product under the uniform controlled substances act shall be immediately effective upon the date of publication in the federal register of the interim final rule.
- (c) When a federal final rule is issued pursuant to 21 U.S.C. § 811(j), after interested persons had an opportunity to comment on a federal final interim rule, changes necessary to conform the control or decontrol of a cannabidiol investigational product under subsection (b) shall be immediately effective upon the date of publication in the federal register of the federal final rule.
- (d) Control or decontrol under the uniform controlled substances act in conformance with federal law may be altered by state statute or an emergency or temporary rule or regulation issued by the department to address an immediate danger to public health, safety or welfare.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
