AN ACT concerning drivers' licenses; expiration and renewal; fees;
 amending K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 8-240, 8-243 and 8-247 and repealing the
 existing sections.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 8-240 is hereby amended to read as 7 follows: 8-240. (a) (1) Every application for an instruction permit shall be 8 made upon a form furnished by the division of vehicles and accompanied 9 by a fee of \$2 for class A, B, C or M and \$5 for all commercial classes. 10 Every other application shall be made upon a form furnished by the 11 division and accompanied by an examination fee of \$3, unless a different 12 fee is required by K.S.A. 8-241, and amendments thereto, and by the 13 proper fee for the license for which the application is made. All 14 commercial class applicants shall be charged a \$15 driving test fee for the drive test portion of the commercial driver's license application. If the 15 16 applicant is not required to take an examination or the commercial license drive test, the examination or commercial drive test fee shall not be 17 18 required. The examination shall consist of three tests, as follows: (A) 19 Vision; (B) written; and (C) driving. For a commercial driver's license, the 20 drive test shall consist of three components, as follows: (A) Pre-trip; (B) 21 skills test; and (C) road test. If the applicant fails the vision test, the 22 applicant may have correction of vision made and take the vision test 23 again without any additional fee. If an applicant fails the written test, the 24 applicant may take such test again upon the payment of an additional 25 examination fee of \$1.50. If an applicant fails the driving test, the 26 applicant may take such test again upon the payment of an additional 27 examination fee of \$1.50. If an applicant for a commercial driver's license 28 fails any portion of the commercial drive test, the applicant may take such 29 test again upon the payment of an additional drive test fee of \$10. If an 30 applicant fails to pass all three of the tests within a period of six months 31 from the date of original application and desires to take additional tests, 32 the applicant shall file an application for reexamination upon a form 33 furnished by the division, which shall be accompanied by a reexamination fee of \$3, except that any applicant who fails to pass the written or driving 34 35 portion of an examination four times within a six-month period, shall be 36 required to wait a period of six months from the date of the last failed 1 examination before additional examinations may be given. Upon the filing of such application and the payment of such reexamination fee, the 2 3 applicant shall be entitled to reexamination in like manner and subject to 4 the additional fees and time limitation as provided for examination on an original application. If the applicant passes the reexamination, the 5 6 applicant shall be issued the classified driver's license for which the 7 applicant originally applied, which license shall be issued to expire as if 8 the applicant had passed the original examination.

9 (2) Applicants for class M licenses who have completed prior 10 motorcycle safety training in accordance with department of defense 11 instruction 6055.04 (DoDI 6055.04) are not required to complete further 12 written and driving testing pursuant to paragraph (1) of this subsection.

(3) On and after January 1, 2017, an applicant for a class M license 13 who passes a driving examination administered by the division on a three-14 wheeled motorcycle which is not an autocycle shall have a restriction 15 16 placed on such applicant's license limiting the applicant to the operation of 17 a registered three-wheeled motorcycle. An applicant for a class M license who passes a driving examination administered by the division on a two-18 19 wheeled motorcycle may operate any registered two-wheeled or three-20 wheeled motorcycle.

(4) Any individual applying for a class C license who is 81 years of
age or older shall be exempt from any fees imposed pursuant to paragraph
(1) of this subsection.

24 (b) (1) For the purposes of obtaining any driver's license or 25 instruction permit, an applicant shall submit, with the application, proof of age and proof of identity as the division may require. The applicant also 26 27 shall provide a photo identity document, except that a non-photo identity 28 document is acceptable if it includes both the applicant's full legal name 29 and date of birth, and documentation showing the applicant's name, the 30 applicant's address of principal residence and the applicant's social security 31 number. The applicant's social security number shall remain confidential 32 and shall not be disclosed, except as provided pursuant to K.S.A. 74-2012, 33 and amendments thereto. If the applicant does not have a social security 34 number the applicant shall provide proof of lawful presence and Kansas 35 residency. The division shall assign a distinguishing number to the license 36 or permit.

(2) The division shall not issue any driver's license or instruction permit to any person who fails to provide proof that the person is lawfully present in the United States. Before issuing a driver's license or instruction permit to a person, the division shall require valid documentary evidence that the applicant: (A) Is a citizen or national of the United States; (B) is an alien lawfully admitted for permanent or temporary residence in the United States; (C) has conditional permanent resident status in the United 1 States; (D) has an approved application for asylum in the United States or 2 has entered into the United States in refugee status; (E) has a valid, 3 unexpired nonimmigrant visa or nonimmigrant visa status for entry into 4 the United States; (F) has a pending application for asylum in the United 5 States; (G) has a pending or approved application for temporary protected 6 status in the United States; (H) has approved deferred action status; or (I) 7 has a pending application for adjustment of status to that of an alien 8 lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States or 9 conditional permanent resident status in the United States.

10 (3) If an applicant provides evidence of lawful presence set out in subsections (b)(2)(E) through (2)(I), or is an alien lawfully admitted for 11 12 temporary residence under subsection (b)(2)(B), the division may only 13 issue a driver's license to the person under the following conditions: (A) A driver's license issued pursuant to this subparagraph shall be valid only 14 15 during the period of time of the applicant's authorized stay in the United 16 States or, if there is no definite end to the period of authorized stay, a 17 period of one year; (B) a driver's license issued pursuant to this 18 subparagraph shall clearly indicate that it is temporary and shall state the 19 date on which it expires; (C) no driver's license issued pursuant to this 20 subparagraph shall be for a longer period of time than the time period 21 permitted by K.S.A. 8-247(a), and amendments thereto; and (D) a driver's 22 license issued pursuant to this subparagraph may be renewed, subject at 23 the time of renewal, to the same requirements and conditions as set out in 24 this subsection (b) for the issuance of the original driver's license.

(4) The division shall not issue any driver's license or instruction
permit to any person who is not a resident of the state of Kansas, except as
provided in K.S.A. 8-2,148, and amendments thereto.

(5) The division shall not issue a driver's license to a person holding a
 driver's license issued by another state without making reasonable efforts
 to confirm that the person is terminating or has terminated the driver's
 license in the other state.

32 (6) The parent or guardian of an applicant under 16 years of age shall33 sign the application for any driver's license submitted by such applicant.

34 (c) Every application shall state the full legal name, date of birth, 35 gender and address of principal residence of the applicant, and briefly 36 describe the applicant, and shall state whether the applicant has been 37 licensed as a driver prior to such application, and, if so, when and by what 38 state or country. Such application shall state whether any such license has 39 ever been suspended or revoked, or whether an application has ever been 40 refused, and, if so, the date of and reason for such suspension, revocation 41 or refusal. In addition, applications for commercial drivers' licenses and 42 instruction permits for commercial licenses must include the following: 43 The applicant's social security number; the person's signature; the person's:

1 (1) Digital color image or photograph; or (2) a laser engraved photograph;

2 certifications, including those required by 49 C.F.R. § 383.71(a), effective
3 January 1, 1991; a consent to release driving record information; and, any
4 other information required by the division.

5 (d) When an application is received from a person previously licensed 6 in another jurisdiction, the division shall request a copy of the driver's 7 record from the other jurisdiction. When received, the driver's record shall 8 become a part of the driver's record in this state with the same force and 9 effect as though entered on the driver's record in this state in the original 10 instance.

(e) When the division receives a request for a driver's record fromanother licensing jurisdiction the record shall be forwarded without charge.

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(f) A fee shall be charged as follows:

14 (1) For a class C driver's license issued to a person at least 21 years of
age, but less than 65 years of age, \$18 \$27;

(2) for a class C driver's license issued to a person 65 years of age-or
 older, \$12 but less than 81 years of age, \$14;

(3) for a class C driver's license issued to a person 81 years of age or
older, \$0;

20 (4) for a class M driver's license issued to a person at least 21 years of 21 age, but less than 65 years of age, \$12.50;

(4) (5) for a class M driver's license issued to a person 65 years of age
 or older, \$9;

(5) (6) for a class A or B driver's license issued to a person who is at
 least 21 years of age, but less than 65 years of age, \$24;

(6) (7) for a class A or B driver's license issued to a person 65 years
 of age or older, \$16;

28 (7) (8) for any class of commercial driver's license issued to a person
29 21 years of age or older, \$18; or

30 (8) (9) for class A, B, C or M, or a farm permit, or any commercial
31 driver's license issued to a person less than 21 years of age, \$20.

A fee of \$10 shall be charged for each commercial driver's license endorsement, except air brake endorsements which shall have no charge.

A fee of \$3 per year shall be charged for any renewal of a license issued prior to the effective date of this act to a person less than 21 years of age.

36 If one fails to make an original application or renewal application for a 37 driver's license within the time required by law, or fails to make 38 application within 60 days after becoming a resident of Kansas, a penalty 39 of \$1 shall be added to the fee charged for the driver's license.

(g) Any person who possesses an identification card as provided in
K.S.A. 8-1324, and amendments thereto, shall surrender such
identification card to the division upon being issued a valid Kansas driver's
license or upon reinstatement and return of a valid Kansas driver's license.

(h) The division shall require that any person applying for a driver's
 license submit to a mandatory facial image capture. The captured facial
 image shall be displayed on the front of the applicant's driver's license.

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(i) The director of vehicles may issue a temporary driver's license to an applicant who cannot provide valid documentary evidence as defined by subsection (b)(2), if the applicant provides compelling evidence proving current lawful presence. Any temporary license issued pursuant to this subsection shall be valid for one year.

9 (j) For purposes of this subsection, the division may rely on the 10 division's most recent, existing color digital image and signature image of the applicant for the class C or M driver's license if the division has the 11 12 information on file. The determination on whether an electronic online 13 renewal application or equivalent of a driver's license is permitted shall be 14 made by the director of vehicles or the director's designee. The division 15 shall not renew a driver's license through an electronic online or equivalent 16 process if the license has been previously renewed through an electronic 17 online application in the immediately preceding driver's license period. No 18 renewal under this subsection shall be granted to any person who is: (1) 19 Younger than 30 days from turning 21 years of age; (2) 65 years of age or 20 older; (3) a registered offender pursuant to K.S.A. 22-4901 et seq., and 21 amendments thereto; or (4) has a temporary driver's license issued 22 pursuant to K.S.A. 8-240(b)(3), and amendments thereto, provided the 23 license is not otherwise withdrawn. The secretary of revenue may adopt 24 and administer rules and regulations to implement a program to permit an 25 electronic online renewal of a driver's license.

26 K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 8-243 is hereby amended to read as Sec. 2. 27 follows: 8-243. (a) Upon payment of the required fee, the division shall 28 issue to every applicant qualifying under the provisions of this act the driver's license as applied for by the applicant. Such license shall bear the 29 30 class or classes of motor vehicles which the licensee is entitled to drive, a 31 distinguishing number assigned to the licensee, the full legal name, date of 32 birth, gender, address of principal residence and a brief description of the 33 licensee, either: (1) A digital color image or photograph; or (2) a laser 34 engraved photograph of the licensee, a facsimile of the signature of the 35 licensee and the statement provided for in subsection (b). No driver's 36 license shall be valid until it has been signed by the licensee. All drivers' 37 licenses issued to persons under the age of 21 years shall be readily 38 distinguishable from licenses issued to persons age 21 years or older. In 39 addition, all drivers' licenses issued to persons under the age of 18 years 40 shall also be readily distinguishable from licenses issued to persons age 18 41 years or older. The secretary of revenue shall implement a vertical format 42 to make drivers' licenses issued to persons under the age of 21 more 43 readily distinguishable. Except as otherwise provided, no driver's license

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issued by the division shall be valid until either: (1) A digital color image 1 2 or photograph; or (2) a laser engraved photograph of such licensee has 3 been taken and verified before being placed on the driver's license. The 4 secretary of revenue shall prescribe a fee of not more than \$8 and upon the 5 payment of such fee, the division shall cause either: (1) A digital color 6 image or photograph; or (2) a laser engraved photograph of such applicant 7 to be placed on the driver's license. Upon payment of such fee prescribed 8 by the secretary of revenue, plus payment of the fee required by K.S.A. 8-9 246, and amendments thereto, for issuance of a new license, the division 10 shall issue to such licensee a new license containing either: (1) A digital color image or photograph; or (2) a laser engraved photograph of such 11 12 licensee. A driver's license which does not contain the principal address as 13 required may be issued to persons who are program participants pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 75-455, and amendments thereto, upon payment of 14 the fee required by K.S.A. 8-246, and amendments thereto. All Kansas 15 16 drivers' licenses and identification cards shall have physical security 17 features designed to prevent tampering, counterfeiting or duplication of the 18 document for fraudulent purposes. The secretary of revenue shall 19 incorporate common machine-readable technology into all Kansas drivers' 20 licenses and identification cards.

21 (b) All Kansas drivers' licenses issued to any person 16 years of age 22 or older shall contain a form which provides a statement for making a gift 23 of all or any part of the body of the licensee in accordance with the revised 24 uniform anatomical gift act, K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 65-3220 through 65-3244, 25 and amendments thereto, except as otherwise provided by this subsection. The statement to be effective shall be signed by the licensee in the 26 27 presence of two witnesses who shall sign the statement in the presence of 28 the donor. The gift becomes effective upon the death of the donor. 29 Delivery of the license during the donor's lifetime is not necessary to make 30 a valid gift. Any valid gift statement executed prior to July 1, 1994, shall 31 remain effective until invalidated. The word "Donor" shall be placed on 32 the front of a licensee's driver's license, indicating that the statement for 33 making an anatomical gift under this subsection has been executed by such 34 licensee.

35 Any person who is deaf or hard of hearing may request that the (c) 36 division issue to such person a driver's license which is readily 37 distinguishable from drivers' licenses issued to other drivers and upon such 38 request the division shall issue such license. Drivers' licenses issued to 39 persons who are deaf or hard of hearing and under the age of 21 years shall 40 be readily distinguishable from drivers' licenses issued to persons who are 41 deaf or hard of hearing and 21 years of age or older. Upon satisfaction of 42 subsection (a), the division shall issue a receipt of application permitting 43 the operation of a vehicle consistent with the requested class, if there are

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no other restrictions or limitations, pending the division's verification of
 the information and production of a driver's license.

3 (d) A driver's license issued to a person required to be registered 4 under K.S.A. 22-4901 et seq., and amendments thereto, shall be assigned a 5 distinguishing number by the division which will readily indicate to law 6 enforcement officers that such person is a registered offender. The division 7 shall develop a numbering system to implement the provisions of this 8 subsection.

9 (e) (1) Any person who is a veteran may request that the division issue to such person a driver's license which shall include the designation 10 "VETERAN" displayed on the front of the driver's license at a location to 11 be determined by the secretary of revenue. In order to receive a license 12 described in this subsection, the veteran must provide proof of the 13 veteran's military service and honorable discharge or general discharge 14 under honorable conditions, including a copy of the veteran's DD214 form 15 16 or equivalent.

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(2) As used in this subsection, "veteran" means a person who:

(A) Has served in: The army, navy, marine corps, air force, coast
 guard, air or army national guard or any branch of the military reserves of
 the United States; and

(B) has been separated from the branch of service in which the person
 was honorably discharged or received a general discharge under honorable
 conditions.

(3) The director of vehicles may adopt any rules and regulationsnecessary to carry out the provisions of this subsection.

(f) Any individual applying for a class C license who is 81 years of
age or older shall be exempt from any fee imposed pursuant to subsection
(a).

29 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 8-247 is hereby amended to read as 30 follows: 8-247. (a) (1) All original licenses shall expire as follows:

(A) Licenses issued to persons who are at least 21 years of age, but
less than 65 years of age shall expire on the sixth *eighth* anniversary of the
date of birth of the licensee which is nearest the date of application;

(B) licenses issued to persons who are 65 years of age-or older, but *less than 81 years of age*, shall expire on the fourth anniversary of the date
of birth of the licensee which is nearest the date of application;

(C) licenses issued to persons who are 81 years of age or older shall
expire on the second anniversary of the date of birth of the licensee that is
nearest the date of application;

40 (D) any commercial drivers license shall expire on the fourth 41 anniversary of the date of birth of the licensee which is nearest the date of 42 application;

43 (D)(E) licenses issued to an offender, as defined in K.S.A. 22-4902,

and amendments thereto, who is required to register pursuant to the
 Kansas offender registration act, K.S.A. 22-4901 et seq., and amendments
 thereto, shall expire every year on the date of birth of the licensee; or

4 (E)(F) licenses issued to persons who are less than 21 years of age 5 shall expire on the licensee's twenty-first 21^{st} birthday.

6 (2) All renewals under: (A) Paragraph (1) (A) shall expire on every 7 sixth eighth anniversary of the date of birth of the licensee; (B) paragraph 8 (1) (B) and (C) (D) shall expire on every fourth anniversary of the date of 9 birth of the licensee; (C) paragraph (1)(C) shall expire on every second anniversary of the date of birth of the licensee; (D) paragraph (1)(D) (1) 10 (E) shall expire every year on the date of birth of the licensee; and (D) (E) 11 12 paragraph (1) (E) (1)(F), if a renewal license is issued, shall expire on the licensee's twenty-first 21st birthday. No driver's license shall expire in the 13 14 same calendar year in which the original license or renewal license is 15 issued, except that if the foregoing provisions of this section shall require 16 the issuance of a renewal license or an original license for a period of less 17 than six calendar months, the license issued to the applicant shall expire in accordance with the provisions of this subsection. 18

19 (b) If the driver's license of any person expires while such person is 20 outside of the state of Kansas and such person is on active duty in the 21 armed forces of the United States, or is the spouse or a person who is 22 residing with and is a dependent of such person on active duty, the license 23 of such person shall be renewable, without examination, at any time prior 24 to the end of the sixth month following the discharge of such person from 25 the armed forces, or within 90 days after residence within the state is 26 reestablished, whichever time is sooner. If the driver's license of any 27 person under this subsection expires while such person is outside the 28 United States, the division shall provide for renewal by mail, as long as the 29 division has a photograph or digital image of such person maintained in the division's records. A driver's license renewed under the provisions of 30 31 this subsection shall be renewed by mail only once.

(c) At least 30 days prior to the expiration of a person's license the division shall mail a notice of expiration or renewal application to such person at the address shown on the license. The division shall include with such notice a written explanation of substantial changes to traffic regulations enacted by the legislature.

(d) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), every driver's license
shall be renewable on or before its expiration upon application and
payment of the required fee and successful completion of the examinations
required by subsection (e). Application for renewal of a valid driver's
license shall be made to the division in accordance with rules and
regulations adopted by the secretary of revenue. Such application shall
contain all the requirements of subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-240(b), and

1 amendments thereto. Upon satisfying the foregoing requirements of this 2 subsection, and if the division makes the findings required by K.S.A. 8-3 235b, and amendments thereto, for the issuance of an original license, the 4 license shall be renewed without examination of the applicant's driving 5 ability. If the division finds that any of the statements relating to 6 revocation, suspension or refusal of licenses required under-subsection (b) 7 of K.S.A. 8-240(b), and amendments thereto, are in the affirmative, or if it 8 finds that the license held by the applicant is not a valid one, or if the 9 applicant has failed to make application for renewal of such person's 10 license on or before the expiration date thereof, the division may require the applicant to take an examination of ability to exercise ordinary and 11 12 reasonable control in the operation of a motor vehicle as provided in 13 K.S.A. 8-235d, and amendments thereto. The division shall require any applicant for a class C driver's license who is 81 years of age or older to 14 15 take all examinations required by K.S.A. 8-235d(a), and amendments 16 thereto, every time such person makes an application for renewal of such 17 person's license.

18 (2) Any licensee, whose driver's license expires on their twenty-first 19 21st birthday, shall have 45 days from the date of expiration of such license 20 to make application to renew such licensee's license. Such license shall 21 continue to be valid for such 45 days or until such license is renewed, 22 whichever occurs sooner. A licensee who renews under the provisions of 23 this paragraph shall not be required by the division to take an examination 24 of ability to exercise ordinary and reasonable control in the operation of a 25 motor vehicle as provided in K.S.A. 8-235d, and amendments thereto.

(e) (1) Prior to renewal of a driver's license, the applicant shall pass an examination of eyesight. Such examination shall be equivalent to the test required for an original driver's license under K.S.A. 8-235d, and amendments thereto. A driver's license examiner shall administer the examination without charge and shall report the results of the examination on a form provided by the division.

(2) In lieu of the examination of the applicant's eyesight by the examiner, the applicant may submit a report on the examination of eyesight by a physician licensed to practice medicine and surgery or by a licensed optometrist. The report shall be based on an examination of the applicant's eyesight not more than three months prior to the date the report is submitted, and it shall be made on a form furnished by the division to the applicant.

39 (3) The division shall determine whether the results of the eyesight 40 examination or report is sufficient for renewal of the license and, if the 41 results of the eyesight examination or report is insufficient, the division 42 shall notify the applicant of such fact and return the license fee. In 43 determining the sufficiency of an applicant's eyesight, the division may request an advisory opinion of the medical advisory board, which is
 hereby authorized to render such opinions.

3 (4) An applicant who is denied a license under this subsection (e) 4 may reapply for renewal of such person's driver's license, except that if 5 such application is not made within 90 days of the date the division sent 6 notice to the applicant that the license would not be renewed, the applicant 7 shall proceed as if applying for an original driver's license.

8 (5) When the division has good cause to believe that an applicant for 9 renewal of a driver's license is incompetent or otherwise not qualified to 10 operate a motor vehicle in accord with the public safety and welfare, the division may require such applicant to submit to such additional 11 12 examinations as are necessary to determine that the applicant is qualified 13 to receive the license applied for. Subject to paragraph (6) of this subsection, in so evaluating such qualifications, the division may request 14 an advisory opinion of the medical advisory board which is hereby 15 16 authorized to render such opinions in addition to its duties prescribed by 17 subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-255b(b), and amendments thereto. Any such 18 applicant who is denied the renewal of such a driver's license because of a 19 mental or physical disability shall be afforded a hearing in the manner 20 prescribed by subsection (c) of K.S.A. 8-255(c), and amendments thereto.

21 (6) Seizure disorders which are controlled shall not be considered a 22 disability. In cases where such seizure disorders are not controlled, the 23 director or the medical advisory board may recommend that such person 24 be issued a driver's license to drive class C or M vehicles and restricted to 25 operating such vehicles as the division determines to be appropriate to 26 assure the safe operation of a motor vehicle by the licensee. Restricted 27 licenses issued pursuant to this paragraph shall be subject to suspension or 28 revocation. For the purpose of this paragraph, seizure disorders which are 29 controlled means that the licensee has not sustained a seizure involving a 30 loss of consciousness in the waking state within six months preceding the 31 application or renewal of a driver's license and whenever a person licensed 32 to practice medicine and surgery makes a written report to the division 33 stating that the licensee's seizures are controlled. The report shall be based 34 on an examination of the applicant's medical condition not more than three 35 months prior to the date the report is submitted. Such report shall be made 36 on a form furnished to the applicant by the division. Any physician who 37 makes such report shall not be liable for any damages which may be 38 attributable to the issuance or renewal of a driver's license and subsequent 39 operation of a motor vehicle by the licensee.

(f) If the driver's license of any person expires while such person is
outside the state of Kansas, the license of such person shall be extended
for a period not to exceed six months and shall be renewable, without a
driving examination, at any time prior to the end of the sixth month

1 following the original expiration date of such license or within 10 days 2 after such person returns to the state, whichever time is sooner. This 3 subsection (f) shall not apply to temporary drivers' licenses issued pursuant 4 to subsection (b)(3) of K.S.A. 8-240(b)(3), and amendments thereto.

5 (g) The division shall reference the website of the agency in a 6 person's notice of expiration or renewal under subsection (c). The division 7 shall provide the following information on the website of the agency:

8 (1) Information explaining the person's right to make an anatomical 9 gift in accordance with K.S.A. 8-243, and amendments thereto, and the 10 revised uniform anatomical gift act, K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 65-3220 through 11 65-3244, and amendments thereto;

12 (2) information describing the organ donation registry program maintained by the Kansas federally designated organ procurement 13 organization. The information required under this paragraph shall include, 14 in a type, size and format that is conspicuous in relation to the surrounding 15 16 material, the address and telephone number of Kansas' federally 17 designated organ procurement organization, along with an advisory to call 18 such designated organ procurement organization with questions about the 19 organ donor registry program;

(3) information giving the applicant the opportunity to be placed onthe organ donation registry described in paragraph (2);

(4) inform the applicant that, if the applicant indicates under this
subsection a willingness to have such applicant's name placed on the organ
donor registry described in paragraph (2), the division will forward the
applicant's name, gender, date of birth and most recent address to the organ
donation registry maintained by the Kansas federally designated organ
procurement organization, as required by paragraph (6);

(5) the division may fulfill the requirements of paragraph (4) by oneor more of the following methods:

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(A) Providing such information on the website of the agency; or

(B) providing printed material to an applicant who personally appearsat an examining station;

33 (6) if an applicant indicates a willingness under this subsection to 34 have such applicant's name placed on the organ donor registry, the division 35 shall within 10 days forward the applicant's name, gender, date of birth and 36 most recent address to the organ donor registry maintained by the Kansas 37 federally designated organ procurement organization. The division may 38 forward information under this subsection by mail or by electronic means. 39 The division shall not maintain a record of the name or address of an 40 individual who indicates a willingness to have such person's name placed 41 on the organ donor registry after forwarding that information to the organ 42 donor registry under this subsection. Information about an applicant's 43 indication of a willingness to have such applicant's name placed on the

organ donor registry that is obtained by the division and forwarded under
 this paragraph shall be confidential and not disclosed.

3 (h) Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, any offender under 4 subsection (a)(1)(D) (a)(1)(E) who held a valid driver's license on the 5 effective date of this act may continue to operate motor vehicles until the 6 next anniversary of the date of birth of such offender. Upon such date such 7 driver's license shall expire and the offender shall be subject to the 8 provisions of this section.
