AN ACT concerning legal publications; authorizing use of internet 1 2 websites for legal publications; amending K.S.A. 12-1651 and 64-101 3 and repealing the existing sections. 4 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 6 New Section 1. (a) Except as provided for cities, counties and school 7 districts in K.S.A. 12-1651 and 64-101, and amendments thereto, any 8 provision of law that requires any board or entity to provide one or more 9 publications in a newspaper of general circulation may be fulfilled by 10 publication on an internet website that: 11 (1) Is the official internet website for the board or entity or has been 12 selected by the board or entity to be the official publication source for such 13 board or entity; 14 (2) is not password protected; 15 (3) is accessible to members of the general public; and (4) does not have any fee associated with or charged for accessing the 16 17 website. 18 (b) Publication on an internet website shall comply with any time and 19 date requirements that are statutorily imposed upon a board or entity as 20 though publication was made in a newspaper. When publication is made 21 on an internet website pursuant to this section, such publication shall 22 remain on the website for at least 90 days. 23 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 12-1651 is hereby amended to read as follows: 12-24 1651. (a) The governing body of each city of the second and third class 25 shall designate by resolution a newspaper or internet website to be the 26 official-city newspaper publication source for the city. Once designated, 27 the newspaper or internet website shall be the official-city newspaper-28 publication source for the city until such time as the governing body 29 designates a different newspaper or internet website. 30 (b) TheIf a newspaper is selected for as the official publications of eities publication source for a city of the second-and or third class, the 31 32 newspaper shall be one which has have the following qualifications: 33 (1) It must be published at least weekly 50 times each year and have 34 been so published for at least one year prior to the publication of any

(2) It must be entered at the post office of publication as second-class

2 (3) More than 50% of the circulation must be sold to the subscribers
3 either on a daily, weekly, monthly or yearly basis.

4 (4) It shall have general paid circulation on a daily, weekly, monthly
5 or yearly basis in the county and shall not be a trade, religious or fraternal
6 publication.

7 (c) If an internet website is selected for the official publication source 8 for a city of the second or third class, the internet website shall have the 9 following qualifications:

(1) It must not be password protected.

(2) It must be accessible to members of the general public.

12 (3) No fee shall be associated with or charged for accessing the 13 website.

(d) Any provision of law that requires a city to provide one or more
publications in a newspaper may be fulfilled by publication on an official
internet website. Publication on an internet website shall comply with any
time and date requirements that are statutorily imposed upon a city as
though publication was made in a newspaper. When publication is made
on an official internet website, such publication shall remain on the
website for at least 90 days.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 64-101 is hereby amended to read as follows: 64-101. (a) The governing body of each city of the first class shall designate by resolution a newspaper *or internet website* to be the official-eity newspaper *publication source for the city*. Once designated, the newspaper *or internet website* shall be the official-eity newspaper publication source for the city until such time as the governing body designates a different newspaper *or internet website*.

No legal notice, advertisement or publication of any kind required or provided by any of the laws of the state of Kansas, to be published in a newspaper, shall have any force or effect unless the same is published in-a newspaper which: the official publication source for the city.

32 (b) If a newspaper is selected as the official publication source for a 33 city of the first class, the newspaper shall have the following 34 qualifications:

(1) Is published at least weekly 50 times a year and has been so
published for at least one year prior to the publication of any official city
publication;

(2) is entered at the post office as periodical class mail matter;

(3) has general paid circulation on a daily, weekly, monthly or yearly
basis in the county in which the city is located and is not a trade, religious
or fraternal publication; and

42 (4) is published in the county in which the city publishing the official43 publication is located. If there is no newspaper published in the county, the

newspaper shall be published in Kansas and shall have general paid
 circulation in the county.

3 (b)(c) If an internet website is selected as the official publication 4 source for a city of the first class, it shall have the following 5 qualifications:

(1) The internet website must not be password protected;
(2) it must be accessible to members of the general public; and

7 (2) it must be accessible to members of the general public; and
8 (3) no fee shall be associated with or charged for accessing the
9 website.

(d) Any provision of law that requires a city to provide one or more
publications in a newspaper may be fulfilled by publication on an official
internet website. Publication on an internet website shall comply with any
time and date requirements that are statutorily imposed upon a city as
though publication was made in a newspaper. When publication is made
on an official internet website, such publication shall remain on the
website for at least 90 days.

(e) The board of county commissioners of each county shall designate
by resolution a newspaper or internet website to be the official-countynewspaper publication source for the county. Once designated, the
newspaper or internet website shall be the official county newspaperpublication source for the county until such time as the board designates a
different newspaper or internet website. The newspaper selected for the
official publications of a county shall be a newspaper which:

(f) If a newspaper is selected for the official publication source for a
 county, it shall have the following qualifications:

(1) Is published at least weekly 50 times each year and has been so
published for at least one year prior to the publication of any official
county publication;

(2) is entered at the post office in the county of publication asperiodical class mail matter, which county shall be located in Kansas;

(3) has general paid circulation on a daily, weekly, monthly or yearly
basis in the county and is not a trade, religious or fraternal publication; and

(4) is published in the county publishing the official publication. If
there is no newspaper published in the county, the newspaper shall be
printed in Kansas and have general paid circulation in the county.

(c) Whenever the board of education of a school district is required to
 publish a legal notice, advertisement or other publication in a newspaper
 having general circulation in the school district, such newspaper shall be
 one which:

40 (g) If an internet website is selected for the official publication source 41 for a county, it shall have the following qualifications:

42 (1) The internet website must not be password protected;

43 (2) it must be accessible to members of the general public; and

1 (3) no fee shall be associated with or charged for accessing the 2 website.

3 (h) Any provision of law that requires a county to provide one or 4 more publications in a newspaper may be fulfilled by publication on an 5 official internet website. Publication on an internet website shall comply 6 with any time and date requirements that are statutorily imposed upon a 7 county as though publication was made in a newspaper. When publication 8 is made on an official internet website, such publication shall remain on 9 the website for at least 90 days.

(i) (1) The board of education of each school district shall designate
by resolution a newspaper or internet website to be the official publication
source for the school district. Once designated, the newspaper or internet
website shall be the official publication source for the school district until
such time as the board of education of the school district designates a
different newspaper or internet website.

16 (2) If a newspaper is selected as the official publication source for a 17 school district, the newspaper shall have the following qualifications:

18 (1) (A) Is published at least weekly 50 times each year and has been 19 so published for at least one year prior to the publication of any school 20 district publication;

21 (2) (B) is entered at the post office in the school district of publication 22 as periodical class mail matter;

(3) (C) has general paid circulation on a daily, weekly, monthly or
 yearly basis in the school district and is not a trade, religious or fraternal
 publication; and

(4) (D) is published in the school district publishing the official
 publication. If there is no newspaper published in the school district, the
 newspaper shall be published in Kansas and shall have general paid
 circulation in the school district.

30 (d) Nothing contained in this section shall invalidate the publication 31 in a newspaper which has resumed publication after having suspended 32 publication all or part of the time that the United States has been engaged 33 in war with any foreign nation and six months next following the cessation 34 of hostilities if such newspaper resumes publication in good faith under the 35 same ownership as it had when it suspended publication. Nothing in this 36 section shall invalidate the publication in a newspaper which has simply 37 changed its name or moved its place of publication from one part of the 38 county to another part, or suspended publication on account of fire, flood, 39 strikes, shortages of materials or other unavoidable accidents for not toexceed 10 weeks within the year last preceding the first publication of the 40 legal notice, advertisement or publication. All legal publications heretofore 41 42 made which otherwise would be valid, that have been made in anewspaper which, on account of flood, fire, strikes, shortages of materials 43

1 or other unavoidable accident, has suspended publication for a period of 2 not exceeding 10 weeks, are hereby legalized.

3 (3) If an internet website is selected for the official publication source 4 for a school district, it shall have the following qualifications:

(A) The internet website must not be password protected;

(B) it must be accessible to members of the general public; and

7 (C) no fee shall be associated with or charged for accessing the 8 website.

9 (4) Any provision of law that requires a school district to provide one 10 or more publications in a newspaper may be fulfilled by publication on an 11 official internet website. Publication on an internet website shall comply 12 with any time and date requirements that are statutorily imposed upon a 13 school district as though publication was made in a newspaper. When 14 publication is made on an official internet website, such publication shall 15 remain on the website for at least 90 days.

16 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 12-1651 and 64-101 are hereby repealed.

17 Sec. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 18 publication in the statute book.
