Re: Testimony opposing HB 2671

To: Chairman Barker and Members of the House Federal and State Affairs Committee,

My name is Terry Humphrey, lobbyist for the Humane Society of the United States and the Humane Society Legislative Fund of Kansas. Today, I am speaking on behalf of a coalition of animal welfare organizations in Kansas who oppose greyhound racing.

As you might expect, these organizations do not have a position on sports wagering legislation. However, since HB 2671 incentivizes the return of greyhound racing in two ways, we are opposed to the bill.

As written, the bill permits racetrack gaming facilities to offer sports wagering. According to KELA, the Kansas Expanded Lottery Act, in order for racetrack gaming facilities to open, they must run live greyhound races. Thus, the wording of the bill makes sports wagering at racetrack gaming facilities **dependent on live greyhound racing** and provides a financial incentive for the return of this cruel activity. For these reasons, the bill should be amended to exclude racetrack gaming facility managers from offering sports wagering.

The second issue we oppose in the bill is the definition of a "sporting event." As written, HB 2671 only excludes sports betting on greyhound racing that occurs in Kansas and is regulated by the Kansas Parimutuel Racing Act. However, the proposed Kansas sports wagering legislation should not permit betting on greyhound races anywhere; for example, betting on races or individual dogs in lowa or other states where tracks are still operational.

Greyhound Racing Rejected

We know that the public does not support greyhound racing. When the last greyhound racetrack closed in 2008, racetrack gambling revenue had declined by 95 percent. Over the last ten years, the country's disdain for greyhound racing has only galvanized. In November 2018, Floridians overwhelmingly voted to outlaw dog racing in their state, joining residents from 40 other states who also have outlawed greyhound racing due to animal cruelty issues and declining revenue.

In 2016, the Unified Government of Wyandotte County and Kansas City, Kansas voted to prohibit dog racing at The Woodlands. This is a clear indication of public sentiment on the issue. We urge you to follow their lead.

Overall, the message is clear: the American public is not interested in and will not support this outdated and cruel activity no matter how the activity is presented.

In closing, we respectfully request that you amend HB 2671 as outlined above to guarantee that sports wagering does not include greyhound racing.
