I work full time selling crop insurance as an independent agent. As an independent agent, I receive no health care benefits. My family currently carries health insurance through the farm and recently the premiums have been astronomical. The farm pays \$25,000 a year for health insurance premiums. This premium is for our family of five and my brother-in-law's family of three. That is just health insurance with no dental or vision coverage! Unfortunately, we cannot afford to go without health insurance because we have a child that has health issues in the past. We applaud Kansas Farm Bureau for fighting on our behalf by introducing SB 32. This bill is the necessary authority KFB needs to create a member healthcare benefit that could be our ticket to affordable health coverage.
