## Planning for Next Year - Stage

1

- Currently have over 80 educators working on standards and assessments
- Grade Band the standards
- Pre-K-2, 3-4, 6-8 and 9-12
- Deconstruct standards into priority and extended standards
- Combine standards in Arts/Humanities and STEAM
- Develop competencies for all learning standards


## Planning for Next Year - Stage

 1- Recommend assessment levels to ensure learning at a "3" or "4" on competencies related to the learning standards
- Formative and interim state assessments, MAP testing, AIMSweb, DIBELS and FastBridge will be examined to ensure levels " 3 " and "4" learning with competencies


Planning for Next Year - Stage 2

- Starts on June 1, 2020
- Hundreds of educators, parents, board members and legislators work on two distinct parts of the plan:
- HOW to implement a new learning plan
- What and How are the conditions for logistically opening schools and ensuring safety
- Work to be completed by July 1, 2020


## Planning for Next Year - Stage

2

- Work released and reviewed by all Kansas superintendents on Friday, July 10, 2020
- State Board receives report and votes on guidance plans on July 14-15, 2020
- If approved, entire Pre-K-12 field receives guidance document(s) to start planning for 2020-21 school year
