SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 18 by Senate Committee on Judiciary

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 18 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 18 would add the Attorney General to the list of officials able to enter into diversion agreements. If the Attorney General enters into a diversion agreement, any diversion costs or fees collected would be credited to the Fraud and Abuse Criminal Prosecution Fund. The bill would allow the Attorney General to enter into agreements with the appropriate county or district attorney or other appropriate parties regarding the supervision of conditions of the diversion agreement.

The Attorney General estimates there could be additional revenue to the Fraud and Abuse Criminal Prosecution Fund; however, any additional revenue would be negligible. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 18 is not reflected in *The FY 2020 Governor's Budget Report*.
