AN ACT concerning motor vehicles; relating to distinctive license plates;
 changing the requirements for distinctive and educational institution
 license plate production; *providing for the proud educator, alpha kappa alpha, knights of Columbus and current and veteran members of the United States army, navy, marine corps, air force and coast guard license plates;* amending K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,141<u>-and</u>, 8-1,142 and 8-1,147 and repealing the existing sections.

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9 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,141 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-1,141. (a) Any new distinctive license plate authorized for issuance on and after July 1, 1994, shall be subject to the personalized license plate fee prescribed by K.S.A. 8-132(c), and amendments thereto. This section shall not apply to any distinctive license plate authorized prior to July 1, 1994.

(b) The director of vehicles shall not issue any new distinctive license
plate authorized for issuance on and after July 1, 1995, unless there is a
guarantee of an initial issuance of at least-500 250 license plates.

(c) The provisions of this section shall not apply to distinctive license
plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,145, and amendments *thereto*, or K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-177d, 8-1,163, 8-1,166, 8-1,185, 8-1,186,
8-1,187<u>or</u>, 8-1,188, section 6, section 7, section 8, section 9 or section
10, and amendments thereto.

(d) The provisions of subsection (a), shall not apply to distinctive
license plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,146 or 8-1,148,
and amendments thereto, or K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,153, 8-1,158 or 81,161, and amendments thereto.

(e) The provisions of subsection (f) shall not apply to distinctive
license plates issued under the provisions of K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,160
and 8-1,183, and amendments thereto, except that the division shall delay
the manufacturing and issuance of such distinctive license plate until the
division has received not less than 1,000 orders for such plate, including
payment of the personalized license plate fee required under subsection
(a). Upon certification by the director of vehicles to the director of

accounts and reports that not less than 1,000 paid orders for such plate
 have been received, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer
 \$40,000 from the state highway fund to the distinctive license plate fund.

4 (f) (1) Any person or organization sponsoring any distinctive license
5 plate authorized by the legislature on and after July 1, 2004, shall submit
6 to the division of vehicles a nonrefundable amount not to exceed \$20,000
7 \$5,000, to defray the division's cost for developing such distinctive license
8 plate.

9 (2) All moneys received under this subsection shall be remitted by the 10 secretary of revenue to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of 11 12 each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in 13 the state treasury to the credit of the distinctive license plate fund which is hereby created in the state treasury. All moneys credited to the distinctive 14 license plate fund shall be used by the department of revenue only for the 15 16 purpose associated with the development of distinctive license plates. All 17 expenditures from the distinctive license plate application fee fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts, upon warrants of the director 18 of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the 19 20 secretary of the department of revenue.

(g) (1) Except for educational institution license plates issued under
K.S.A. 8-1,142, and amendments thereto, the director of vehicles shall
discontinue the issuance of any distinctive license plate authorized prior to
July 1, 2004, and which is subject to the provisions of subsection (b) if:

(A) Less than 500 license plates, including annual renewals, are issued for that distinctive license plate by July 1, 2006; and

(B) less than 250 125 license plates, including annual renewals, are
 issued for that distinctive license plate during any subsequent two-year
 period after July 1, 2006.

30 (2) The director of vehicles shall discontinue the issuance of any
 31 distinctive license plate authorized on and after July 1, 2004, if:

(A) Less than-500 250 plates, including annual renewals, are issued
 for that distinctive license plate by the end of the second year of sales; and

(B) less than-250 125 license plates, including annual renewals, are
 issued for that distinctive license plate during any subsequent two-year
 period.

(h) An application for any distinctive license plate issued after December 31, 2012, and the corresponding royalty fee may be collected either by the county treasurer or the entity benefiting from the issuance of the distinctive license plate. Annual royalty payments collected by the county treasurers shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of a segregated royalty fund which shall
 be administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the royalty
 fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of
 the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved
 by the state treasurer or the state treasurer's designee. Payments from the
 royalty fund shall be made to the entity benefiting from the issuance of the
 distinctive license plate on a monthly basis.

8 (i) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for any distinctive 9 license plate, the division shall produce such distinctive license plate for a 10 motorcycle upon request to the division by the organization sponsoring the 11 distinctive license plate.

(j) In addition to any residency requirements for all distinctive license plates, any person not a resident of Kansas, serving as a member of the armed forces stationed in this state shall be eligible to apply for any distinctive license plate as if the individual was a resident of this state. Such person shall be eligible to renew the distinctive license plate registration as long as the person is still stationed in this state at the time the registration is renewed.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 8-1,142 is hereby amended to read as
follows: 8-1,142. (a) As used in this section, "educational institution"
means:

(1) Any state educational institution under the control and supervisionof the state board of regents;

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(2) any municipal university;

(3) any not-for-profit independent institution of higher education
which is accredited by the north central association of colleges and
secondary schools accrediting agency based on its requirements as of April
1, 1985, is operated independently and not controlled or administered by
the state or any agency or subdivision thereof, maintains open enrollment
and the main campus or principal place of operation of which is located in
Kansas;

32 (4) any community college organized and operating under the laws of33 this state; and

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(5) Haskell Indian Nations university.

35 (b) Any owner or lessee of one or more passenger vehicles, trucks 36 registered for a gross weight of not more than 20,000 pounds or 37 motorcycles, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance with the 38 provisions of this section, may be issued one educational institution license 39 plate for each such passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle. Such license 40 plates shall be issued for the same period of time as other license plates upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided 41 in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, plus the payment of an 42 43 additional fee of \$5 for each plate, and either the payment to the county

treasurer of the logo use royalty payment established by the alumni 1 2 association or foundation or the presentation of the annual emblem use 3 authorization statement provided for in subsection (c).

4 (c) Any educational institution may authorize through its officially 5 recognized alumni association or foundation the use of such institution's 6 official emblems to be affixed on license plates as provided by this section. 7 Any royalty payment derived from this section, except reasonable 8 administrative costs, shall be used for recognition of academic 9 achievement or excellence subject to the approval of the chancellor or 10 president of the educational institution. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee may annually apply to the alumni association or foundation for the use of 11 12 the institution's emblems. Upon annual application and payment to either: 13 (1) The alumni association or foundation in an amount of not less than \$25 14 nor more than \$100 as an emblem use royalty payment for each 15 educational institution license plate to be issued, the alumni association or 16 foundation shall issue to the motor vehicle owner or lessee, without further 17 charge, an emblem use authorization statement, which shall be presented 18 by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of registration; or (2) the 19 county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment for each license plate to 20 be issued.

21 (d) Any applicant for an educational institution license plate may 22 make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such 23 person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished 24 by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for the educational institution 25 license plates shall provide either the annual emblem use authorization 26 statement provided for in subsection (c) or pay to the county treasurer the 27 logo use royalty payment established by the alumni association or 28 foundation. Application for registration of a passenger vehicle, truck or 29 motorcycle and issuance of the license plates under this section shall be 30 made by the owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of 31 vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.

32 (e) No registration or educational institution license plate issued 33 under this section shall be transferable to any other person.

34 (f) The director of vehicles may transfer educational institution 35 license plates from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

36 (g) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made 37 annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (b), in the 38 manner prescribed in subsection (b) of K.S.A. 8-132, and amendments 39 thereto. No renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until 40 such applicant provides to the county treasurer either the annual emblem 41 use authorization statement provided for in subsection (c) or the payment 42 of the annual emblem use royalty payment established by the alumni 43 association or foundation. If such emblem use authorization statement is

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not presented at the time of registration or faxed by the alumni association

or foundations, or the annual emblem use royalty payment is not made tothe county treasurer, the applicant shall be required to comply with K.S.A.

8-143, and amendments thereto, and return the educational institutionlicense plates to the county treasurer of such person's residence.

6 (h) The director of vehicles shall not issue any educational institution 7 license plates for any educational institution, unless such educational 8 institution's alumni association or foundation guarantees the initial 9 issuance of at least-500 100 license plates.

10 (i) The director of vehicles shall discontinue the issuance of an 11 educational institution's license plate authorized under this section if:

(1) Less than-500 100 educational institution license plates, including
 annual renewals, are issued for an educational institution by the end of the
 second year of sales; and

(2) less than-250 50 educational institution license plates, including
 annual renewals, are issued for an educational institution during any
 subsequent two-year period.

(j) Each educational institution's alumni association or foundationshall:

(1) Pay the initial cost of silk-screening design for such educational
license plates; and

(2) (2) provide to all county treasurers-a *an electronic mail address or* toll-free telephone number where applicants can call the alumni association or foundation for information concerning the application process or the status of their license plate application.

(k) Each educational institution's alumni association or foundation,
with the approval of the director of vehicles and subject to the availability
of materials and equipment, shall design a license plate to be issued under
the provisions of this section.

(1) As a condition of receiving the educational institution license plate
and any subsequent registration renewal of such plate, the applicant must
provide consent to the division authorizing the division's release of motor
vehicle record information, including the applicant's name, address,
emblem use royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle type to the
relevant educational institution and the state treasurer.

36 (m) Annual royalty payments collected by county treasurers under 37 this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the 38 provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. In the case of an 39 educational institution that is a state educational institution as defined by 40 K.S.A. 76-711, and amendments thereto, upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state 41 42 treasury to the credit of the appropriate account of the restricted fees fund 43 of such state educational institution. In the case of an educational

1 institution which is not a state educational institution as defined by K.S.A.

2 76-711, and amendments thereto, upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall remit the entire amount to the educational institutions 3 4 emblem royalty fund, which is hereby created in the state treasury and shall be administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the 5 6 educational institutions emblem royalty fund shall be made in accordance 7 with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and 8 reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the 9 state treasurer's designee. Payments from the educational institutions emblem royalty fund to the respective educational institutions shall be 10 made on a monthly basis. 11

12 New Sec. 3. (a) On and after January 1, 2020, any owner or lessee of one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight 13 of 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance 14 with the provisions of this section, may be issued one proud educator 15 16 license plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such license 17 plates shall be issued for the same time as other license plates upon 18 proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided in 19 K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and either the payment to the county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment established by the 20 21 Kansas educators support foundation or the presentation of the annual 22 logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b).

23 (b) The Kansas educators support foundation may authorize the use of its proud educator logo to be affixed on license plates as provided 24 by this section. Any royalty payment received pursuant to this section 25 shall be used to support the Kansas educators support foundation. Any 26 27 motor vehicle owner or lessee annually may apply to the Kansas 28 educators support foundation for the use of such logo. Upon payment to 29 either: (1) The Kansas educators support foundation in an amount of 30 not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 as a logo use royalty payment for 31 each license plate to be issued, the Kansas educators support foundation 32 shall issue to the motor vehicle owner or lessee, without further charge, 33 a logo use authorization statement, which shall be presented by the 34 motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of registration; or (2) the 35 county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment for each license plate to 36 he issued.

(c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may
make application for such plates not less than 60 days prior to such
person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and
furnished by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license
plate shall either provide the annual logo use authorization statement
provided for in subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use
royalty payment established by the Kansas educators support

1 foundation. Application for registration of a passenger vehicle or truck

2 and issuance of the license plate under this section shall be made by the

owner or lessee in a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon
 forms furnished by the director.

5 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall 6 be transferable to any other person.

7 (e) The director of vehicles may transfer proud educator license 8 plates from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

(f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made, 9 annually, upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the 10 manner prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No 11 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such 12 applicant either provides to the county treasurer the annual logo use 13 authorization statement provided for in subsection (b) or the payment of 14 the logo use royalty payment as established by the Kansas educators 15 16 support foundation. If such logo use authorization statement is not presented at the time of registration or faxed by the Kansas educators 17 support foundation, or the annual logo use royalty payment is not made 18 19 to the county treasurer at the time of registration, the applicant shall be 20 required to comply with K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and 21 return the license plate to the county treasurer of such person's 22 residence.

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(g) The Kansas educators support foundation shall:

(1) Pay the initial cost of design for license plates authorized by this
 section; and

(2) provide to all county treasurers a toll-free telephone number or
 electronic mail address where applicants can contact the Kansas
 educators support foundation for information concerning the
 application process or the status of their license plate application.

30 (h) The Kansas educators support foundation, with the approval of 31 the director of vehicles and subject to the availability of materials and 32 equipment, shall design a plate to be issued under the provisions of this 33 section.

(i) As a condition of receiving the proud educator license plate and
any subsequent registration renewal of such plate, the applicant must
provide consent to the division authorizing the division's release of
motor vehicle record information, including the applicant's name,
address, logo use royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle
type to the Kansas educators support foundation and the state treasurer.

40 *(j)* Annual logo use royalty payments collected by county treasurers 41 under this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance 42 with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon 43 receipt of each such remittance the state treasurer shall deposit the

1 entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the Kansas educators support foundation royalty fund, which is hereby created in the state 2 treasury and shall be administered by the state treasurer. All 3 expenditures from the Kansas educators support foundation royalty 4 5 fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon 6 warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to 7 vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the state treasurer's designee. No 9 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such 10 applicant either provides to the county treasurer either the annual logo 11 use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b) or the 12 payment of the logo use royalty payment as established by alpha kappa 13 alpha. (h) Alpha kappa alpha, with the approval of the director of vehicles
and subject to the availability of materials and equipment, shall design a
plate to be issued under the provisions of this section.

(i) As a condition of receiving the alpha kappa alpha license plate
and any subsequent registration renewal of such plate, the applicant
must provide consent to the division authorizing the division's release of
motor vehicle record information, including the applicant's name,
address, logo use royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle
type to alpha kappa alpha and the state treasurer.

36 (j) Annual logo use royalty payments collected by county treasurers 37 under this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance 38 with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon 39 receipt of each such remittance the state treasurer shall deposit the 40 entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the alpha kappa alpha royalty fund, which is hereby created in the state treasury and shall be 41 administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the alpha 42 43 kappa alpha royalty fund shall be made in accordance with

Such 10 license plates shall be issued for the same time as other license plates 11 upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as 12 provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and either the 13 payment to the county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment 14 established by the knights of Columbus Kansas state council or the 15 16 presentation of the annual logo use authorization statement provided for 17 in subsection (b).

18 (b) The knights of Columbus Kansas state council may authorize 19 the use of its logo to be affixed on license plates as provided by this 20 section. Any royalty payment received pursuant to this section shall be used to support the knights of Columbus Kansas state council. Any 21 22 motor vehicle owner or lessee annually may apply to the knights of 23 Columbus Kansas state council for the use of such logo. Upon annual application and payment to either: (1) The knights of Columbus Kansas 24 25 state council in an amount of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 as a logo use royalty payment for each license plate to be issued, the knights 26 of Columbus Kansas state council shall issue to the motor vehicle owner 27 28 or lessee, without further charge, a logo use authorization statement, 29 which shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of registration; or (2) the county treasurer of the logo use royalty 30 31 payment for each license plate to be issued.

No 6 7 renewal of registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant either provides to the county treasurer either the annual logo 8 use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b) or the 9 payment of the logo use royalty payment as established by the knights of 10 Columbus Kansas state council. 36 (j) Annual logo use royalty payments collected by county treasurers 37 under this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance 38 with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon 39 receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the knights of 40 Columbus royalty fund, which is hereby created in the state treasury and 41 shall be administered by the state treasurer.
