AN ACT concerning education; relating to the duration of the school term;
authorizing the grant of a waiver from school term requirements;
amending K.S.A. 72-3117 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 Section 1. K.S.A. 72-3117 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-7 3117. (a) The state board of education may waive the requirements of law 8 relating to the duration of the school term in any school year upon 9 application for such waiver by a school district. The waiver may be 10 granted by the state board of education upon: (1) Certification by a board 11 of education that, due to disaster, conditions resulting from widespread or 12 severe property damage caused by the disaster or other conditions 13 restricting the operation of public schools will exist in the school district 14 for an inordinate period of time; and (2) a determination by the state board that the school district cannot reasonably adjust its schedule to comply 15 16 with such requirements of law. The period of time school is not maintained during any school year due to conditions resulting from disaster, upon 17 18 granting of the waiver by the state board of education, shall be considered 19 a part of the school term.

20 (b) As used in this section, the term "disaster" means the *declaration* 21 of a state of disaster emergency by the governor pursuant to K.S.A. 48-22 924, and amendments thereto, closure of schools by order issued by a 23 county or joint board of health, a local health officer pursuant to K.S.A. 24 65-119, and amendments thereto, or the secretary of health and 25 environment pursuant to K.S.A. 65-126, and amendments thereto, or 26 occurrence of widespread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or 27 property resulting from any natural or manmade cause, including, but not 28 limited to, fire, flood, earthquake, tornado, wind, storm, epidemics, air 29 contamination, blight, drought, infestation, or explosion.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 72-3117 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after itspublication in the Kansas register.
