Madam Chair Landwehr and Distinguished Members of the House Health and Human Services Committee,

I stand in support of HB 2498, particularly regarding the portion that does not allow the KS Department of Health and Environment to require a COVID-19 vaccine for children in daycare facilities as well as children in public school K-12. Power and authority over children resides with parents and guardians, not the government. I do not co-parent with the government, and I will not ever take orders from a government entity in vaccination recommendations as it pertains to the failing COVID-19 vaccine that is conducting its trials in humans right now since there wasn't time to do so prior to the launch of these vaccines.

If you believe the public's children have the right to a public education, you'd be hampering that ability if a parent did not choose to vaccinate their child for the coronavirus.
