Testimony in Support of House Bill 2177

Mister Chairman and members of the committee, my name is Eric Stafford, Vice President of Government Affairs for the Kansas Chamber. The Kansas Chamber represents small, medium and large businesses of all industry segments across the state. We appreciate the opportunity to testify in support of House Bill 2177, which creates a streamlined process to allow for easier consolidation of special districts (defined in the bill) by cities. This bill is the same as HB 2510 that was heard and passed by the House last year, but unfortunately was lost due to the early shutdown.

According to governing.com, citing 2017 US Census Bureau data, states with the most counties, cities, towns and other general local governments are:

- Illinois
- Minnesota
- Pennsylvania
- Ohio
- Kansas
- Wisconsin
- Michigan
- North Dakota
- Indiana
- New York

With Kansas in the top five for total number of local governments (3,897 total entities and 1,799 special districts), and a stagnant population pattern statewide, local governments in areas where the population continues to decline will be faced with hard decisions. Any assistance the Legislature could offer to help create more efficient government to benefit taxpayers, we express our support. HB 2177 helps cities and special districts merge by eliminating the need for legislative approval. Another positive step would be to apply the same streamlined ability included in HB 2177 to counties.
