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**Testimony to the House Transportation Committee  
In Support of HB2245**

February 24, 2021

Chairman Proehl and Committee Members:

Our associations support HB2245. The bill would create a voluntary process for holders of a Kansas drivers license or ID card to add emergency contact information to the state system.

Notification of family members in cases of severe injury or death is a common task of law enforcement. Identifying who to contact and the contact information can often be a daunting task. The notifications may be delayed as we search for the contact information. This can be critical for medical care authorizations, especially for a juvenile.

The proposed program would be strictly voluntary on the part of the individual license or ID holder. [Section 1, subsection (c), page 1, lines 24-32] It also provides limited access to the information. [Section 1, subsection (b), page 1 lines 16-23]
