

Written Testimony on HB 2103

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) is pleased to provide testimony in support of HB 2103. House Bill 2103 establishes a Kansas pesticide waste disposal program to be administered by the secretary of agriculture for the collection and disposal of pesticide waste in the state.

House Bill 2103 will provide funding for the safe collection and disposal of pesticide waste material. If left unattended, containers of unused pesticide may leak their contents into soil and pose a health hazard for people later coming into contact with the soil. In addition to unintentional releases, providing a collection program will prevent intentional dumping of unwanted pesticides.

Over time, pesticide released into the soil may percolate downward and contaminate groundwater used as a drinking water source for private and public wells. Clean up of contamination is time and resource intensive compared to prevention.

Collection and disposal of pesticide waste material will eliminate a source of contamination of soil and groundwater and provide for the protection of public health.
