In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2342 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2342 would amend the Kansas Pharmacy Act by authorizing pharmacists to prescribe and dispense self-administered oral hormonal contraceptives. The Board of Pharmacy would be required to adopt rules and regulations to implement and administer the provisions of the bill.

The Board of Pharmacy indicates that enactment of HB 2342 would increase expenditures by \$99,822 from the Board of Pharmacy Fee Fund for FY 2022. These costs would include \$5,000 for administrative expenditures, including drafting regulations, holding board meetings, updating forms, and publishing information. The Board states other expenditures would include \$94,822 for an additional temporary 1.00 FTE Attorney position

The costs for the position include \$87,282 for salary and fringe benefits and \$7,540 for other operating expenses.
