1	AN ACT concerning public safety officers, military personnel and
2	prisoners of war; expanding educational benefits for spouses and
3	dependents of such officers and personnel who are injured while
4	performing service-related duties; amending K.S.A. 75-4364 and
5	repealing the existing section.

7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
8	Section 1. K.S.A. 75-4364 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-
9	4364. (a) As used in this section:
10	(1) "Dependent" means: (A) A birth child, adopted child or stepchild;
11	or (B) any child other than the foregoing who is actually dependent in
12	whole or in part on the individual and who is related to such individual by
13	marriage or consanguinity.
14	(2) "Emergency medical service provider" means the same as defined
15	in K.S.A. 65-6112, and amendments thereto.
16	(3) "Firefighter" means a person who is: (A) Employed by any city,
17	county, township or other political subdivision of the state and who is
18	assigned to the fire department thereof and engaged in the fighting and
19	extinguishment of fires and the protection of life and property therefrom;
20	or (B) a volunteer member of a fire district, fire department or fire
21	company.
22	(4) "Kansas educational institution" means and includes community
23	colleges, the municipal university, state educational institutions, the
24	institute of technology at Washburn university and technical colleges.
25	(5) "Law enforcement officer" means a person who by virtue of office
26	or public employment is vested by law with a duty to maintain public
27	order or to make arrests for violation of the laws of the state of Kansas or
28	ordinances of any municipality thereof or with a duty to maintain or assert
29	custody or supervision over persons accused or convicted of crime, and
30	includes wardens, superintendents, directors, security personnel, officers
31	and employees of adult and juvenile correctional institutions, jails or other
32	institutions or facilities for the detention of persons accused or convicted
33	of crime, while acting within the scope of their authority.
34	(6) "Military service" means any active service in any armed service
35	of the United States and any active state or federal service in the Kansas

army or air national guard. 36

(7) "Prisoner of war" means any person who was a resident of Kansas 1 at the time the person entered service of the United States armed forces 2 and who, while serving in the United States armed forces, has been 3 declared to be a prisoner of war, as established by the United States 4 secretary of defense, after January 1, 1960. 5

6 (8) "Public safety officer" means a law enforcement officer-or, a 7 firefighter-or, an emergency medical service provider or a public safety 8 emplovee.

9 (9) "Resident of Kansas" means a person who is a domiciliary resident as defined by K.S.A. 76-729, and amendments thereto. 10

(10) "Spouse" means the spouse of a deceased public safety officer or 11 12 deceased member of the military service who has not remarried.

"State board" means the state board of regents. (11)

(12) "Public safety employee" means any employee of a law 14 enforcement office, sheriff's department, municipal fire department, 15 16 volunteer and non-volunteer fire protection association, emergency 17 medical services provider or correctional institution of the department of corrections. 18

(b) (1) Every Kansas educational institution shall provide for 19 enrollment without charge of tuition or fees for: 20

21 (H) (A) Any eligible dependent or spouse of a public safety officer 22 who:

23 *(i) Was injured or disabled while performing duties as a public safety* 24 officer: or

25 (ii) died as the result of injury sustained while performing duties as a public safety officer so long as such dependent or spouse is eligible; 26 27

(2)(B) any dependent or spouse of any resident of Kansas who:

28 (i) Died or was injured or disabled on or after September 11, 2001, 29 while, and as a result of, serving in military service; or

(ii) is entitled to compensation for a service-connected disability of at 30 least 80% because of a public statute administered by the department of 31 veterans affairs or a military department as a result of injuries or 32 33 accidents sustained in combat after September 11, 2001; and

(3)(C) any prisoner of war.

(2) Any such dependent or spouse and any prisoner of war shall be 35 eligible for enrollment at a Kansas educational institution without charge 36 37 of tuition or fees for not to exceed 10 semesters of undergraduate 38 instruction, or the equivalent thereof, at all such institutions.

39 (c) Subject to appropriations therefor, any Kansas educational institution, at which enrollment, without charge of tuition or fees, of a 40 prisoner of war or a dependent or spouse is provided for under subsection 41 (b), may file a claim with the state board for reimbursement of the amount 42 43 of such tuition and fees. In any fiscal year, such reimbursement shall not

exceed a total of \$350,000. The state board shall include in its budget 1 estimates pursuant to K.S.A. 75-3717, and amendments thereto, a request 2 3 for appropriations to cover tuition and fee claims pursuant to this section. 4 The state board shall be responsible for payment of reimbursements to 5 Kansas educational institutions upon certification by each such institution 6 of the amount of reimbursement to which entitled. Payments to Kansas 7 educational institutions shall be made upon vouchers approved by the state 8 board and upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports. Payments 9 may be made by issuance of a single warrant to each Kansas educational 10 institution at which one or more eligible dependents or spouses or prisoners of war are enrolled for the total amount of tuition and fees not 11 12 charged for enrollment at that institution. The director of accounts and 13 reports shall cause such warrant to be delivered to the Kansas educational 14 institution at which any such eligible dependents or spouses or prisoners of war are enrolled. If an eligible dependent or spouse or prisoner of war 15 16 discontinues attendance before the end of any semester, after the Kansas 17 educational institution has received payment under this subsection, the 18 institution shall pay to the state the entire amount that such eligible 19 dependent or spouse or prisoner of war would otherwise qualify to have 20 refunded, not to exceed the amount of the payment made by the state in 21 behalf of such dependent or spouse or prisoner of war for the semester. All 22 amounts paid to the state by Kansas educational institutions under this 23 subsection shall be deposited in the state treasury and credited to the state 24 general fund.

(d) The state board shall adopt rules and regulations for administration of the provisions of this section and shall determine the qualification of persons as dependents and spouses of public safety officers or United States military personnel and the eligibility of such persons for the benefits provided for under this section.
