1 AN ACT concerning motor vehicles; relating to distinctive license plates;  
2 providing for the Braden's hope for childhood cancer, proud educator,  
3 *{delta sigma theta,} Gadsden flag* and alpha kappa alpha distinctive  
4 license plates; providing distinctive license plates for current and  
5 veteran members of the United States army, navy, marine corps, air  
6 force, coast guard and space force; modifying requirements to begin  
7 production on distinctive license plates; *requiring reporting by*  
8 *sponsoring organizations of income and expenditures derived from*  
9 *certain distinctive license plate fees; {allowing certain license plates*  
10 *issued by the division of vehicles to be personalized license plates;}*  
11 amending K.S.A. 2020 Supp. *{8-132,}* 8-1,141, 8-1,142 and 8-1,147  
12 and repealing the existing sections.

14 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

15 New Section 1. (a) On and after January 1, 2022, any owner or lessee  
16 of one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight  
17 of 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance  
18 with the provisions of this section, may be issued one Braden's hope for  
19 childhood cancer license plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck.  
20 Such license plate shall be issued for the same time as other license plates  
21 upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as provided  
22 in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and either the payment to the  
23 county treasurer of the logo use royalty payment or the presentation of the  
24 annual logo use authorization statement provided for in subsection (b).

25 (b) Braden's hope for childhood cancer may authorize the use of the  
26 organization's logo to be affixed on license plates as provided by this  
27 section. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee may apply annually to  
28 Braden's hope for childhood cancer for use of such logo. Such owner or  
29 lessee shall pay an amount of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 to  
30 Braden's hope for childhood cancer as a logo use royalty payment for each  
31 such license plate to be issued. The logo use royalty payment shall be paid  
32 to either:

1 (1) Braden's hope for childhood cancer, which shall issue to the motor  
2 vehicle owner or lessee, without further charge, a logo use authorization  
3 statement that shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at  
4 the time of registration; or

5 (2) the county treasurer.

6 (c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may  
7 make application for such license plate not less than 60 days prior to such  
8 person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished  
9 by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plate shall  
10 either provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in  
11 subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use royalty payment.  
12 Application for registration of a passenger vehicle or truck and issuance of  
13 the license plate under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in  
14 a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by  
15 the director.

16 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be  
17 transferable to any other person.

18 (e) The director of vehicles may transfer a Braden's hope for  
19 childhood cancer license plate from a leased vehicle to a purchased  
20 vehicle.

21 (f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually,  
22 upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner  
23 prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No renewal of  
24 registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant provides to  
25 the county treasurer either the annual logo use authorization statement  
26 provided for in subsection (b) or the payment of the annual royalty  
27 payment. If such statement is not presented at the time of registration or  
28 faxed by Braden's hope for childhood cancer, or the annual royalty  
29 payment is not made to the county treasurer, the applicant shall be required  
30 to comply with the provisions of K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto,  
31 and return the license plate to the county treasurer of such person's  
32 residence.

33 (g) Braden's hope for childhood cancer shall provide to all county  
34 treasurers an electronic mail address where applicants can contact Braden's  
35 hope for childhood cancer for information concerning the application  
36 process or the status of such applicant's license plate application.

37 (h) Braden's hope for childhood cancer, with the approval of the  
38 director of vehicles, shall design a plate to be issued under the provisions  
39 of this section.

40 (i) As a condition of receiving the Braden's hope for childhood cancer  
41 license plate and any subsequent registration renewal of such license plate,  
42 the applicant shall consent to the division authorizing the division's release  
43 of motor vehicle record information, including the applicant's name,

1 address, royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle type to  
2 Braden's hope for childhood cancer and the state treasurer.

3 (j) The collection and remittance of annual royalty payments by the  
4 county treasurer shall be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,141(h),  
5 and amendments thereto.

6 New Sec. 2. (a) On and after January 1, 2022, any owner or lessee of  
7 one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight of  
8 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance with  
9 the provisions of this section, may be issued one proud educator license  
10 plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such license plates shall be  
11 issued for the same time as other license plates upon proper registration  
12 and payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and  
13 amendments thereto, and either the payment to the county treasurer of the  
14 logo use royalty payment or the presentation of the annual logo use  
15 authorization statement provided for in subsection (b).

16 (b) The Kansas educators support foundation may authorize the use  
17 of the organization's logo to be affixed on license plates as provided by  
18 this section. Any motor vehicle owner or lessee may apply annually to the  
19 Kansas educators support foundation for use of such logo. Such owner or  
20 lessee shall pay an amount of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 to the  
21 Kansas educators support foundation as a logo use royalty payment for  
22 each such license plate to be issued. The logo use royalty payment shall be  
23 paid to either:

24 (1) The Kansas educators support foundation, who shall issue to the  
25 motor vehicle owner or lessee, without further charge, a logo use  
26 authorization statement that shall be presented by the motor vehicle owner  
27 or lessee at the time of registration; or

28 (2) the county treasurer.

29 (c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may  
30 make application for such license plate not less than 60 days prior to such  
31 person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished  
32 by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plate shall  
33 either provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in  
34 subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use royalty payment.  
35 Application for registration of a passenger vehicle or truck and issuance of  
36 the license plate under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in  
37 a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by  
38 the director.

39 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be  
40 transferable to any other person.

41 (e) The director of vehicles may transfer a proud educator license  
42 plate from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

43 (f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually,

1 upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner  
2 prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No renewal of  
3 registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant provides to  
4 the county treasurer either the annual logo use authorization statement  
5 provided for in subsection (b) or the payment of the annual royalty  
6 payment. If such statement is not presented at the time of registration or  
7 faxed by the Kansas educators support foundation, or the annual royalty  
8 payment is not made to the county treasurer, the applicant shall be required  
9 to comply with the provisions of K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto,  
10 and return the license plate to the county treasurer of such person's  
11 residence.

12 (g) The Kansas educators support foundation shall provide to all  
13 county treasurers an electronic mail address where applicants can contact  
14 the Kansas educators support foundation for information concerning the  
15 application process or the status of such applicant's license plate  
16 application.

17 (h) The Kansas educators support foundation, with the approval of  
18 the director of vehicles, shall design a plate to be issued under the  
19 provisions of this section.

20 (i) As a condition of receiving the proud educator license plate and  
21 any subsequent registration renewal of such license plate, the applicant  
22 shall consent to the division authorizing the division's release of motor  
23 vehicle record information, including the applicant's name, address,  
24 royalty payment amount, plate number and vehicle type to the Kansas  
25 educators support foundation and the state treasurer.

26 (j) The collection and remittance of annual royalty payments by the  
27 county treasurer shall be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,141(h),  
28 and amendments thereto, except that payments from the Kansas educators  
29 support foundation royalty fund shall be made on a monthly basis to the  
30 Kansas independent college foundation, unless another designee is made  
31 by the Kansas educators support foundation.

32 New Sec. 3. (a) On and after January 1, 2022, any owner or lessee of  
33 one or more passenger vehicles or trucks registered for a gross weight of  
34 20,000 pounds or less, who is a resident of Kansas, upon compliance with  
35 the provisions of this section, may be issued one alpha kappa alpha license  
36 plate for each such passenger vehicle or truck. Such license plates shall be  
37 issued for the same time as other license plates upon proper registration  
38 and payment of the regular license fee as provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and  
39 amendments thereto, and either the payment to the county treasurer of the  
40 logo use royalty payment or the presentation of the annual logo use  
41 authorization statement provided for in subsection (b).

42 (b) Alpha kappa alpha may authorize the use of the organization's  
43 logo to be affixed on license plates as provided by this section. Any motor

1 vehicle owner or lessee may apply annually to alpha kappa alpha for the  
2 use of such logo. Such owner or lessee shall pay an amount of not less  
3 than \$25 nor more than \$100 as a logo use royalty payment for each such  
4 license plate to be issued. The logo use royalty payment shall be paid to  
5 either:

6 (1) Alpha kappa alpha, who shall issue to the motor vehicle owner or  
7 lessee, without further charge, a logo use authorization statement that shall  
8 be presented by the motor vehicle owner or lessee at the time of  
9 registration; or

10 (2) the county treasurer.

11 (c) Any applicant for a license plate authorized by this section may  
12 make application for such license plate not less than 60 days prior to such  
13 person's renewal of registration date, on a form prescribed and furnished  
14 by the director of vehicles, and any applicant for such license plate shall  
15 either provide the annual logo use authorization statement provided for in  
16 subsection (b) or pay to the county treasurer the logo use royalty payment.  
17 Application for registration of a passenger vehicle or truck and issuance of  
18 the license plate under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in  
19 a manner prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by  
20 the director.

21 (d) No registration or license plate issued under this section shall be  
22 transferable to any other person.

23 (e) The director of vehicles may transfer an alpha kappa alpha license  
24 plate from a leased vehicle to a purchased vehicle.

25 (f) Renewals of registration under this section shall be made annually,  
26 upon payment of the fee prescribed in subsection (a), in the manner  
27 prescribed in K.S.A. 8-132(b), and amendments thereto. No renewal of  
28 registration shall be made to any applicant until such applicant provides to  
29 the county treasurer either the annual logo use authorization statement  
30 provided for in subsection (b) or the payment of the annual royalty  
31 payment. If such statement is not presented at the time of registration or  
32 faxed by alpha kappa alpha, or the annual royalty payment is not made to  
33 the county treasurer, the applicant shall be required to comply with the  
34 provisions of K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto, and return the  
35 license plate to the county treasurer of such person's residence.

36 (g) Alpha kappa alpha shall provide to all county treasurers an  
37 electronic mail address where applicants can contact alpha kappa alpha for  
38 information concerning the application process or the status of such  
39 applicant's license plate application.

40 (h) Alpha kappa alpha, with the approval of the director of vehicles,  
41 shall design a license plate to be issued under the provisions of this  
42 section.

43 (i) As a condition of receiving the alpha kappa alpha license plate and

1 any subsequent registration renewal of such license plate, the applicant  
2 shall consent to the division authorizing the division's release of motor  
3 vehicle record information, including the applicant's name, address,  
4 royalty payment amount, license plate number and vehicle type to alpha  
5 kappa alpha and the state treasurer.

6 (j) The collection and remittance of annual royalty payments by the  
7 county treasurer shall be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1,141(h),  
8 and amendments thereto.

9 New Sec. 4. (a) On and after January 1, 2022, any owner or lessee of  
10 one or more passenger vehicles, trucks of a gross weight of 20,000 pounds  
11 or less or motorcycles, who is a resident of Kansas, and who submits  
12 satisfactory proof to the director of vehicles, in accordance with rules and  
13 regulations adopted by the secretary of revenue, that such person is  
14 currently serving in the United States army or has separated from the  
15 United States army and was honorably discharged, upon compliance with  
16 the provisions of this section, may be issued one distinctive license plate  
17 for each such passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle designating such  
18 person as a current member or veteran of the United States army. Such  
19 license plate shall be issued for the same period of time as other license  
20 plates upon proper registration and payment of the regular license fee as  
21 provided in K.S.A. 8-143, and amendments thereto.

22 (b) Any person who is a current member or veteran of the United  
23 States army may make application for such distinctive license plate, not  
24 less than 60 days prior to such person's renewal of registration date, on a  
25 form prescribed and furnished by the director of vehicles, and any  
26 applicant for the distinctive license plate shall furnish the director with  
27 proof as the director shall require that the applicant is a current member or  
28 veteran of the United States army. Application for the registration of a  
29 passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle and issuance of the license plate  
30 under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in a manner  
31 prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.

32 (c) No registration or distinctive license plate issued under the

22 proof as the director shall require that the applicant is a current member or  
23 veteran of the United States navy. Application for the registration of a

9 proof as the director shall require that the applicant is a current member or  
10 veteran of the United States coast guard. Application for the registration of  
11 a passenger vehicle, truck or motorcycle and issuance of the license plate  
12 under this section shall be made by the owner or lessee in a manner  
13 prescribed by the director of vehicles upon forms furnished by the director.

14 (c) No registration or distinctive license plate issued under the

4 proof as the director shall require that the applicant is a current member or

19 (h) The director of vehicles shall not issue any educational institution  
20 license plates for any educational institution, unless such educational  
21 institution's alumni association or foundation guarantees the initial  
22 issuance of at least ~~500~~ 100 license plates.

23 (i) The director of vehicles shall discontinue the issuance of an  
24 educational institution's license plate authorized under this section if:

25 (1) ~~Less~~ Fewer than ~~500~~ 100 educational institution license plates,  
26 including annual renewals, are issued for an educational institution by the  
27 end of the second year of sales; and

28 (2) ~~less~~ fewer than ~~250~~ 50 educational institution license plates,  
29 including annual renewals, are issued for an educational institution during  
30 any subsequent two-year period.

31 (j) Each educational institution's alumni association or foundation

5 relevant educational institution and the state treasurer.

6 (m) Annual royalty payments collected by county treasurers under  
7 this section shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the  
8 provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. In the case of an  
9 educational institution that is a state educational institution as defined by  
10 K.S.A. 76-711, and amendments thereto, upon receipt of each such  
11 remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state  
12 treasury to the credit of the appropriate account of the restricted fees fund  
13 of such state educational institution. In the case of an educational  
14 institution which is not a state educational institution as defined by K.S.A.  
15 76-711, and amendments thereto, upon receipt of each such remittance, the  
16 state treasurer shall remit the entire amount to the educational institutions  
17 emblem royalty fund, which is hereby created in the state treasury and  
18 shall be administered by the state treasurer. All expenditures from the  
19 educational institutions emblem royalty fund shall be made in accordance  
20 with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and  
21 reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the state treasurer or the  
22 state treasurer's designee. Payments from the educational institutions  
23 emblem royalty fund to the respective educational institutions shall be  
24 made on a monthly basis.
