## HOUSE BILL No. 2713

AN ACT concerning retirement and pensions; relating to the Kansas police
 and firemen's retirement system; affiliating for membership for certain
 security officers of the department of corrections and certain law
 enforcement officers and employees of the Kansas department of
 wildlife and parks; establishing employee and employer contributions.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

8 Section 1. (a) On and after July 1, 2022, the department of corrections 9 shall be an eligible employer as defined in K.S.A. 74-4952, and 10 amendments thereto, and shall affiliate on July 1, 2022, with the Kansas 11 police and firemen's retirement system established under K.S.A. 74-4951 12 et seq., and amendments thereto. The department of corrections shall make 13 application for affiliation with such system in the manner provided by 14 K.S.A. 74-4954, and amendments thereto, to be effective on the July 1 next following application. The department of corrections shall affiliate for 15 16 membership in the system of such officers and employees for participating 17 service credit.

(b) The division of the budget and the governor shall include in the
budget and in the budget request for appropriations for personnel services
the amount required to satisfy the employer's obligation under this section
as certified by the board of trustees of the system and shall present the
same to the legislature for allowance and appropriation. Upon affiliation,
the department of corrections shall pay to the system a sum sufficient to
satisfy such obligations as certified by the board.

(c) The determination of retirement, death or disability benefits shall
be computed upon the basis of credited service, as used in K.S.A. 74-4951
et seq., and amendments thereto, but shall include only participating
service with the department of corrections, commencing on and after the
effective date of affiliation by the department of corrections with the
Kansas police and firemen's retirement system.

(d) Any rights or benefits accruing to any security officer employed
by the department of corrections prior to the effective date of affiliation
shall be determined pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 74-4901 et seq.,
and amendments thereto. Any security officer who becomes a member
pursuant to this section, who has a vested retirement benefit pursuant to
K.S.A. 74-4917, and amendments thereto, and who terminates

1 employment prior to attaining a vested benefit pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4963,

2 and amendments thereto, may have such service credited for purposes of 3 computing retirement benefits pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4901 et seq., and 4 amendments thereto. Notwithstanding any provision of K.S.A. 74-4901 et 5 seq., and amendments thereto, to the contrary, if a security officer has a 6 vested retirement benefit pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4963, and amendments 7 thereto, and a vested retirement benefit pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4917, and 8 amendments thereto, and retires on or after such security officer's normal 9 retirement date under K.S.A. 74-4957a, and amendments thereto, then 10 such security officer shall also be deemed to have retired for the purposes of K.S.A. 74-4901 et seq., and amendments thereto, and shall be eligible 11 12 for such vested retirement benefit pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4917, and 13 amendments thereto.

(e) Every person who is employed as a security officer on or after the
entry date of the department of corrections into the Kansas police and
firemen's retirement system shall become a member of the Kansas police
and firemen's retirement system.

(f) Except as otherwise provided by this act, any security officer
employed by the department of corrections who becomes a member of the
Kansas police and firemen's retirement system shall be subject to the
provisions of K.S.A. 74-4951 through 74-4970, and amendments thereto.

(g) Beginning with the first payment of compensation for services of a security officer after becoming a member of the Kansas police and firemen's retirement system, the employer shall deduct from the compensation of such member 7.15% as the employee contribution to the system. Such deductions shall be remitted, deposited and credited as provided in K.S.A. 74-4965, and amendments thereto.

(h) As used in this section, "security officer" means any person, as
certified to the board by the secretary of corrections, who is employed on
or after the effective date of this act as an employee of the department of
corrections:

32 (1) Who is in any position in a job class in the corrections officer or 33 juvenile services corrections officer class series, including, but not limited 34 to, corrections officer I (A), corrections officer I (B), corrections officer II, 35 corrections supervisor I, corrections supervisor II, corrections supervisor 36 III, corrections counselor I, corrections counselor II, unit team supervisor, 37 corrections classification administrator, juvenile corrections officer I (A), 38 juvenile corrections officer I (B), captain, major, juvenile corrections 39 officer II, juvenile corrections officer III, special investigator II, unit team 40 manager, chief of security, EAI investigator or EAI investigator supervisor 41 job class, as all such job classes are described on July 1, 2022, in the state job classification plan in effect for the classified service under the Kansas 42 43 civil service act or who is in a position in any successor job class or classes

- that have been approved under K.S.A. 75-2938, and amendments thereto, 1 2 and who have substantially the same duties and responsibilities thereof;

3 (2) who is promoted prior to or on or after July 1, 2022, from a 4 position in any job class under paragraph (1) to any position in any job 5 class of warden or deputy warden of any correctional institution, training 6 manager, training technician, superintendent, program deputy 7 superintendent, corrections manager I, corrections manager II, staff 8 development specialist, safety and health inspector or safety and health 9 specialist, as such job classes are described on July 1, 2022, in the state job 10 classification plan in effect for the classified service under the Kansas civil service act or to any successor job class or classes that are approved under 11 12 K.S.A. 75-2938, and amendments thereto, and who have substantially the same duties and responsibilities, if the person was employed and had at 13 least three consecutive years of service in any one or more positions in any 14 one or more job classes described in paragraph (1) immediately preceding 15 promotion to the position in a job class under this paragraph and is located 16 at a correctional institution or a juvenile correctional facility; 17

18 (3) who is in any position for which the duties and responsibilities 19 directly and primarily involve operation of power plant facilities within 20 any correctional institution or juvenile correctional facility and involve 21 regular contact with inmates or juvenile offenders;

22 (4) who is in any position for which the duties and responsibilities 23 directly and primarily involve the operation of the correctional industries 24 activity of the department of corrections within a correctional institution or juvenile correctional facility and involve regular contact with inmates or 25 26 iuvenile offenders:

27 (5) who is in any position for which the duties and responsibilities 28 directly and primarily involve supervision of food service or laundry operations within any correctional institution or juvenile correctional 29 30 facility and involve regular contact with inmates or juvenile offenders; or

31 (6) who is in any position for which the duties and responsibilities 32 directly and primarily involve supervision of maintenance operations 33 within any correctional institution or juvenile correctional facility and 34 involve regular contact with inmates or juvenile offenders.

35 (i) As used in this section, references to the department of corrections 36 include correctional institutions as defined by K.S.A. 75-5202, and 37 amendments thereto, and juvenile correctional facilities as defined by 38 K.S.A. 38-2302, and amendments thereto, unless the context requires 39 otherwise

40 Sec. 2. (a) (1) On July 1, 2022, the Kansas department of wildlife and parks shall be an eligible employer as defined in K.S.A. 74-4952, and 41 amendments thereto, and shall affiliate with the Kansas police and 42 43 firemen's retirement system established under the provisions of K.S.A. 74-

1 4951 et seq., and amendments thereto, pursuant to the provisions of this 2 section for membership in the system of officers and employees employed 3 by the Kansas department of wildlife and parks who have successfully 4 completed the required course of instruction for law enforcement officers 5 approved by the Kansas law enforcement training center and are certified 6 as a full-time police officer or law enforcement officer pursuant to the 7 provisions of K.S.A. 74-5607a, and amendments thereto, and who are 8 employed in the parks, public lands or law enforcement division. For 9 purposes of such affiliation for membership in the system of such 10 members, the Kansas department of wildlife and parks shall be considered a new participating employer. The Kansas department of wildlife and 11 12 parks shall make application for affiliation with such system in the manner 13 provided by K.S.A. 74-4954, and amendments thereto, to be effective on 14 the July 1 next following application. The Kansas department of wildlife 15 and parks shall affiliate for membership in the system of such officers and 16 employees for participating service credit.

17 (2) The Kansas department of wildlife and parks shall appropriate 18 and pay a sum sufficient to satisfy any obligations as certified by the board 19 of trustees of the retirement system based on an actuarial valuation of the 20 cost of such affiliation, and the employer contributions of the Kansas 21 department of wildlife and parks shall be as provided in K.S.A. 74-22 4967(1), and amendments thereto.

(b) Each such officer and employee who is employed by the Kansas department of wildlife and parks on or after the entry date of the Kansas department of wildlife and parks into the Kansas police and firemen's retirement system as provided in this section shall become a member of the Kansas police and firemen's retirement system on the first day of such employment and shall be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 74-4951 et seq., and amendments thereto, as applicable.

(c) The division of the budget and the governor shall include in the
budget and in the budget request for appropriations for personnel services
the amount required to satisfy the employer's obligation under this section
as certified by the board of trustees of the system, and shall present the
same to the legislature for allowance and appropriation.

(d) The determination of retirement, death or disability benefits shall
be computed upon the basis of credited services, as used in K.S.A. 744951 et seq., and amendments thereto, but shall include only participating
service with the Kansas department of wildlife and parks, commencing on
and after the effective date of affiliation by the Kansas department of
wildlife and parks with the Kansas police and firemen's retirement system.

(e) In the case of a member who retires on or after July 1, 2022,
whose date of membership in the system is prior to July 1, 1993, and any
member who was in such member's membership waiting period on July 1,

1 1993, and whose date of membership in the system is on or after July 1, 2 1993, shall have such member's employer certify to the Kansas public 3 employees retirement system the number of hours of such member's sick 4 and annual leaves at the time of such member's transfer to the Kansas 5 police and firemen's retirement system. Upon the date of such member's 6 retirement from the Kansas public employees retirement system, such 7 member may use in the calculation of the member's retirement benefit, the 8 average highest annual compensation, as defined in K.S.A. 74-4902(9), 9 and amendments thereto, which shall include but not exceed compensation 10 for the number of sick and annual leave hours certified to the Kansas public employees retirement system on the date of the member's transfer, 11 12 paid to such member for any four years of participating service preceding 13 the transfer to the Kansas police and firemen's retirement system, or the 14 average highest annual salary, as defined in K.S.A. 74-4902(33), and 15 amendments thereto, paid to such member for any three years of 16 participating service preceding retirement or termination of employment, 17 whichever is greater.

(f) Any rights or benefits accruing to any such officer or employee 18 19 employed by the Kansas department of wildlife and parks prior to the 20 effective date of affiliation shall be determined pursuant to the provisions 21 of K.S.A. 74-4901 et seq., and amendments thereto. Any officer and 22 employee who becomes a member pursuant to this section, who has a 23 vested retirement benefit pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4917, and amendments 24 thereto, and who terminates employment prior to attaining a vested benefit 25 pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4963, and amendments thereto, may have such service credited for purposes of computing retirement benefits pursuant to 26 27 K.S.A. 74-4901 et seq., and amendments thereto.

(g) Beginning with the first payment of compensation for services of such officer or employee after becoming a member of the Kansas police and firemen's retirement system, the employer shall deduct from the compensation of such member 7.15% as the employee contribution to the system. Such deductions shall be remitted, deposited and credited as provided in K.S.A. 74-4965, and amendments thereto.
