## **HOUSE BILL No. 2743**

AN ACT concerning firearms; enacting the covert firearms act; establishing criminal penalties for the possession, manufacture, distribution, transportation, shipping or receiving of certain firearms or components.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. As used in sections 1 through 7, and amendments thereto, the following definitions shall apply:

- (a) "Covert firearm" means any firearm that is constructed in a shape or configuration such that it does not resemble a firearm.
- (b) "Firearm frame or receiver" means the part of the firearm that provides housing for one or more of the firearm's internal components, including the hammer, bolt, breechblock, action or firing mechanism. Any such part identified with a serial number shall be presumed, absent an official determination by the bureau of alcohol, tobacco, firearms, and explosives or other reliable evidence to the contrary, to be a frame or receiver.
- (c) "Major component of a firearm" means the slide, barrel, cylinder, trigger group or receiver of a firearm.
- (d) "Security exemplar" means an object, to be fabricated at the direction of the United States attorney general, that is:
- (1) Constructed of 3.7 ounces of material type 17-4 PH stainless steel in a shape resembling a handgun; and
  - (2) suitable for testing and calibrating metal detectors.
- (e) "Three-dimensional printer" means a computer or computer-driven machine device capable of producing a three-dimensional object from a digital model.
- (f) "Undetectable firearm" means a firearm constructed entirely of non-metal substances, or a firearm that, after removal of all of the major components of a firearm, is not detectable by walk-through metal detectors calibrated and operated to detect the security exemplar, or firearm that includes a major component of a firearm that, if subject to the types of detection devices commonly used at airports for security screening, would not generate an image that accurately depicts the shape of the component.
- "Undetectable firearm" does not include a firearm subject to the provisions

(g) "Unfinished frame or receiver" means a forged, case, printed, extruded or machined body or similar article that:

- (1) Has reached a stage in manufacture where it may readily be completed, assembled or converted to be used as the frame or receiver of a functional firearm: or
- (2) is marketed or sold to the public to become or be used as the frame or receiver of a functional firearm once completed, assembled or converted
- (h) "Untraceable firearm" means a firearm for which the sale or distribution chain from a licensed retailer to the point of its first retail sale cannot be traced by law enforcement officials. "Untraceable firearm" does not include:
  - (1) Firearms manufactured prior to 1973;
- (2) muzzle-loading firearms designed to use black powder or its equivalent; and
- (3) firearms that are designed as replicas of antique firearms originally manufactured prior to 1898.
- Sec. 2. (a) No person shall knowingly transport, ship, possess or receive any firearm or firearm frame or receiver with the knowledge that the importer's or manufacturer's serial number has been removed, obliterated or altered in a manner that has disguised or concealed the identity or origin of the firearm.
- (b) This section shall not apply to a firearm manufactured prior to 1973
- (c) Possessing, transporting, shipping or receiving a firearm as described in subsection (a) is a severity level 9, nonperson felony.
- Sec. 3. (a) No person shall knowingly transport, ship, transfer or sell an unfinished firearm frame or receiver unless the:
  - (1) Person is a federally licensed gun dealer or manufacturer;
- (2) name of the manufacturer and an individual serial number are conspicuously placed on the unfinished firearm frame or receiver in accordance with the procedures for the serialization of a firearm in 18 U.S.C. § 923(i); and
- (3) person maintains records for the unfinished firearm frame or receiver in accordance with the requirements for maintenance of records in 18 U.S.C. § 923(g).
- (b) No person shall knowingly possess an unfinished firearm frame or receiver that does not have the name of the manufacturer and individual serial number conspicuously placed on such unfinished firearm frame or receiver or on a major component of the firearm into which the unfinished firearm frame or receiver will be housed. This subsection shall not apply to a federally licensed gun manufacturer during the manufacturing process of a firearm frame or receiver

 (c) Violation of this section is a severity level 9, nonperson felony.

- Sec. 4. (a) Possession of a covert or undetectable firearm is knowingly possessing a covert or undetectable firearm.
- (b) Manufacturing a covert or undetectable firearm is manufacturing, causing to be manufactured, transporting or selling a covert or undetectable firearm.
- (c) Possession of a covert or undetectable firearm is a severity level 9, nonperson felony.
- (d) Manufacturing a covert or undetectable firearm is a severity level 8, nonperson felony.
- Sec. 5. (a) Possessing an untraceable firearm is knowingly possessing an untraceable firearm.
- (b) Manufacturing an untraceable firearm is knowingly manufacturing, assembling, causing to be manufactured or assembled, selling or transferring an untraceable firearm.
- (c) Manufacturing or distributing a firearm is using a threedimensional printer when the person does either of the following:
- (1) Uses a three-dimensional printer or similar device to manufacture or produce a firearm, firearm receiver or major firearm component when not licensed as a manufacturer.
- (2) Distributes by any means, including the internet, to a person who is not licensed as a manufacturer, instructions in the form of computer-aided design files or other code or instructions stored and displayed in electronic format as a digital model that may be used to program a three-dimensional printer to manufacture or produce a firearm, firearm receiver or major component of a firearm.
- (d) Possession of an untraceable firearm is a severity level 9, nonperson felony.
- (e) Manufacturing an untraceable firearm or manufacturing or distributing a firearm using a three-dimensional printer is a severity level 8, nonperson felony.
- Sec. 6. Sections 1 through 7, and amendments thereto, shall be known and may be cited as the covert firearms act.
- Sec. 7. If any provision of this act or the application of this act to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the provisions of this act are severable if the invalidity does not affect the other provisions of this act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or the application of this act that can be given effect without the invalid application.
- Sec. 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
