12 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. The pooled money investment board is authorized and directed to 16 use any moneys in the operating accounts, investment accounts or other 17 investments of the state of Kansas to provide the funds for each such loan. 18 Each such loan shall be repaid without interest within one year from the 19 date of the loan.

20 (f) During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, if it appears that the 21 resources are insufficient to meet in full the estimated expenditures as they 22 become due to meet the financial obligations imposed by law on the water 23 marketing fund (709-00-2255-2100) of the Kansas water office as a result 24 of increases in water rates, fees or charges imposed by the federal 25 government, the pooled money investment board is authorized and 26 directed to loan to the director of the Kansas water office a sufficient 27 amount or amounts of moneys to reimburse the water marketing fund for 28 increases in water rates, fees or charges imposed by the federal 29 government and to allow the Kansas water office to spread such increases 30 to consumers over a longer period, except that no such loan shall be made 31 unless the terms thereof have been approved by the state finance council 32 acting on this matter, which is hereby characterized as a matter of 33 legislative delegation and subject to the guidelines prescribed in K.S.A. 34 75-3711c(c), and amendments thereto. The pooled money investment 35 board is authorized and directed to use any moneys in the operating 36 accounts, investment accounts or other investments of the state of Kansas 37 to provide the funds for each such loan. Each such loan shall bear interest 38 at a rate equal to the net earnings rate for the pooled money investment 39 portfolio at the time of the making of such loan. Such loan shall not be 40 deemed to be an indebtedness or debt of the state of Kansas within the 41 meaning of section 6 of article 11 of the constitution of the state of Kansas. 42 Upon certification to the pooled money investment board by the director of 43 the Kansas water office of the amount of each loan authorized pursuant to

this subsection, the pooled money investment board shall transfer each such amount certified by the director of the Kansas water office from the state bank account or accounts to the water marketing fund of the Kansas

16 (h) During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, in addition to the 17 other purposes for which expenditures may be made by the Kansas water 18 office from moneys appropriated from the state general fund or any special 19 revenue fund or funds for the above agency for fiscal year 2022 by this or other appropriation act of the 2021 regular session of the legislature, 20 21 expenditures shall be made by the Kansas water office from the state 22 general fund or from any special revenue fund or funds for fiscal year 23 2022 to provide for the Kansas water office to lead database coordination 24 of water quality and quantity data for all state water agencies and 25 cooperating federal agencies to facilitate policy-making and such other 26 matters relating thereto.
