1 AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal years ending 2 June 30, 2022, June 30, 2023, June 30, 2024, and June 30, 2025, for 3 state agencies; authorizing certain transfers, capital improvement 4 projects and fees, imposing certain restrictions and limitations, and 5 directing or authorizing certain receipts, disbursements, procedures and 6 acts incidental to the foregoing; amending K.S.A. 2021 Supp. 2-223, 12-1775a, 12-5256, 17-12a601, 65-180, 74-50, 107, 74-99b34, 75-2263, 7 75-6707, 76-775, 76-7,107, 79-2959, 79-2964, 79-3425i, 79-34,171 8 9 and 79-4804 and repealing the existing sections.

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11 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2022, June 30, 2023, June 30, 2024, and June 30, 2025, appropriations are hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and transfers, capital improvement projects, fees, receipts, disbursements and acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as provided in this act.

(c) Provide a follow-up program by providing test results and other 18 19 information to identified physicians; locate infants with abnormal newborn 20 screening test results; with parental consent, monitor infants to assure 21 appropriate testing to either confirm or not confirm the disease suggested 22 by the screening test results; with parental consent, monitor therapy and 23 for treatment infants with confirmed diagnosis of congenital 24 hypothyroidism, galactosemia, phenylketonuria or other genetic diseases 25 being screened under this statute; and establish ongoing education and support activities for individuals with confirmed diagnosis of congenital 26 27 hypothyroidism, galactosemia, phenylketonuria and other genetic diseases 28 being screened under this statute and for the families of such individuals.

The secretary of health and environment shall adopt rules and regulations establishing standards for determining eligibility for state assistance under this section.

As used in this section, "bond special revenue 26 fund" means any special revenue fund or account thereof established in the 27 state treasury prior to or on or after the effective date of this act for the 28 deposit of the proceeds of bonds issued by the Kansas development 29 finance authority for the payment of debt service for bonds issued by the 30 Kansas development finance authority or for any related purpose in 31 accordance with applicable bond covenants.

32 Sec.<u>179.</u> {178.} Federal grants. (a) During the fiscal year ending 33 June 30, 2023, each federal grant or other federal receipt that is received 34 by a state agency named in this act and that is not otherwise appropriated 35 to that state agency for fiscal year 2023 by this or other appropriation act 36 of the 2022 regular session of the legislature is hereby appropriated for 37 fiscal year 2023 for that state agency for the purpose set forth in such 38 federal grant or receipt, except that no expenditure shall be made from and 39 no obligation shall be incurred against any such federal grant or other 40 federal receipt that has not been previously appropriated or reappropriated 41 or approved for expenditure by the governor until the governor has 42 authorized the state agency to make expenditures therefrom.

43 (b) In addition to the other purposes for which expenditures may be

1 made by any state agency that is named in this act and that is not otherwise 2 authorized by law to apply for and receive federal grants, expenditures 3 may be made by such state agency from moneys appropriated for fiscal 4 year 2023 by this act or any other appropriation act of the 2022 regular 5 session of the legislature to apply for and receive federal grants during 6 fiscal year 2023, which federal grants are hereby authorized to be applied 7 for and received by such state agencies: Provided, That no expenditure 8 shall be made from and no obligation shall be incurred against any such 9 federal grant or other federal receipt that has not been previously 10 appropriated or reappropriated or approved for expenditure by the governor until the governor has authorized the state agency to make 11 12 expenditures therefrom.

(c) During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, the provisions of this
section shall not apply to expenditures from the American rescue plan –
state fiscal relief federal fund of the governor's department. Such
expenditures are subject to the provisions of section 22(d).

Sec.<u>180.</u> **[179.]** (a) Any correctional institutions building fund appropriation heretofore appropriated to any state agency named in this or other appropriation act of the 2022 regular session of the legislature and having an unencumbered balance as of June 30, 2022, in excess of \$100 is hereby reappropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, for the same uses and purposes as originally appropriated, unless specific provision is made for lapsing such appropriation.

(b) This subsection shall not apply to the unencumbered balance in
any account of the correctional institutions building fund that was
encumbered for any fiscal year commencing prior to July 1, 2021.

Sec.<u>181.</u> {**180.**} (a) Any Kansas educational building fund appropriation heretofore appropriated to any institution named in this or other appropriation act of the 2022 regular session of the legislature and having an unencumbered balance as of June 30, 2022, in excess of \$100 is hereby reappropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, for the same use and purpose as originally appropriated, unless specific provision is made for lapsing such appropriation.

(b) This subsection shall not apply to the unencumbered balance in
any account of the Kansas educational building fund that was encumbered
for any fiscal year commencing prior to July 1, 2021.

Sec.<u>182.</u> **{181.}** (a) Any state institutions building fund appropriation heretofore appropriated to any state agency named in this or other appropriation act of the 2022 regular session of the legislature and having an unencumbered balance as of June 30, 2022, in excess of \$100 is hereby reappropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, for the same use and purpose as originally appropriated, unless specific provision is made for lapsing such appropriation. 1 (b) This subsection shall not apply to the unencumbered balance in 2 any account of the state institutions building fund that was encumbered for 3 any fiscal year commencing prior to July 1, 2021.

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Sec.<u>183.</u> **{182.}** Any transfers of moneys during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, from any special revenue fund of any state agency named in this act to the audit services fund of the division of post audit under K.S.A. 46-1121, and amendments thereto, shall be in addition to any expenditure limitation imposed on any such fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023.
