AN ACT concerning health and healthcare; relating to COVID-19 vaccine distribution; authorizing counties to adopt prioritized vaccination plans; prohibiting the state from reducing vaccination allotments based on adherence to state guidelines.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) As used in this section:

- (1) "County" means a board of county commissioners acting as a county board of health pursuant to K.S.A. 65-201, and amendments thereto.
- (2) "COVID-19" means the novel coronavirus identified as SARS-CoV-2.
- (3) "COVID-19 vaccine" means a vaccine intended to provide acquired immunity against COVID-19 that has been approved by or received emergency use authorization from the federal food and drug administration.
 - (4) "Department" means the department of health and environment.
- (b) (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a county may adopt a resolution prescribing the county's plan for distribution or administration of COVID-19 vaccines. Such resolution shall describe the county's prioritized vaccination plan and provide detailed definitions of identified population segments that incorporate the following guiding principles:
 - (A) Providing widespread access to COVID-19 vaccines;
 - (B) maximizing vaccine acceptance and public health protection; and
 - (C) minimizing waste and inefficiency.
- (2) A county's prioritized vaccination plan may differ from a vaccination plan or recommendation from the department.
- (3) A county's prioritized vaccination plan shall not cause or permit a COVID-19 vaccine to be distributed or administered in a manner that violates federal law or recommendations.
- 32 (c) (1) The department shall retain authority to allot vaccinations to counties on a schedule as determined by the department.
 - (2) The department shall not reduce or delay vaccination allotments or take any action that has the effect of reducing or delaying vaccination allotments based upon a county's decisions related to vaccine distribution

- (d) This section shall expire on December 31, 2022.
