## SENATE BILL No. 393

AN ACT concerning education; relating to school districts; requiring internet publication of student learning materials and activities used in student instruction; providing penalties for noncompliance therewith.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) (1) On or before July 1 of each year, each school district in this state shall make the following lists and procedures available to the public on the school district's website:

- (A) A list organized by grade level and area of instruction that includes learning materials and activities used for student instruction at each school of the school district in the preceding school year. Such list shall include the title, author, organization and website address, if applicable, that is associated with each material and activity that was assigned, distributed or otherwise presented to students in a course for which students received academic credit or at an educational event in which participation of the student body was required; and
- (B) the school district or school's procedures for documentation, review or approval of any such learning materials or activities.
- (2) The list of learning materials and activities published pursuant to paragraph (1) shall be maintained on the school district's website for at least one year following the school year in which such materials and activities were used.
- (3) If a school district makes the information published pursuant to paragraph (1) available for the current school year, such school district shall update the lists and procedures on the school district's website on an ongoing basis during the school year. Such lists and procedures shall be completed by the last day of such school year.
- (b) School districts may utilize collaborative online document or spreadsheet software that allows multiple users to update or make additions to posted content on an ongoing basis if a link to the list is publicly accessible on the school district website.
- (c) Nothing in this section shall be construed to require the digital reproduction of the materials themselves or the separate reporting of individual components of materials produced as a single volume. For digital volumes that contain works by multiple authors, the school district shall provide either a table of contents or a website address that includes

the works and authors contained in the digital volume.

- (d) (1) Any school district that does not comply with the requirements of this section shall have payment of state funds scheduled to be distributed withheld by the state department of education in accordance with paragraph (2) until the school district meets the requirements of this section
- (2) The amount of state funds to be withheld until the requirements of this section are met is as follows:
- (A) For a first determination of a knowing violation during the school year, 2% of state foundation aid or \$1 million, whichever is less, shall be withheld for the succeeding school year;
- (B) for a second determination of a knowing violation during the school year, 4% of state foundation aid or \$2 million, whichever is less, shall be withheld for the succeeding school year;
- (C) for a third determination of a knowing violation during the school year, 6% of state foundation aid or \$3 million, whichever is less, shall be withheld for the succeeding school year;
- (D) for a fourth determination of a knowing violation during the school year, 8% of state foundation aid or \$4 million, whichever is less, shall be withheld for the succeeding school year; and
- (E) for a fifth determination and any subsequent determination of a knowing violation during the school year, 10% of state foundation aid or \$5 million, whichever is less, shall be withheld for the succeeding school year.
  - (e) As used in this section:
- (1) "Activities" includes a presentation, assembly, lecture or other event facilitated by a school or school district. "Activities" does not include student presentations.
- (2) "Learning materials" includes, but is not limited to, textbooks, reading materials, videos, digital materials, websites and other online applications and any other material given to a student for student instruction.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
