AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for fiscal years ending 1 2 June 30, 2023, June 30, 2024, and June 30, 2025, for state agencies; 3 authorizing certain transfers, capital improvement projects and fees, 4 imposing certain restrictions and limitations, and directing or authorizing certain receipts, disbursements, procedures and acts 5 6 incidental to the foregoing; amending K.S.A. 2021 Supp. 2-223, 12-1775a, 12-5256, 17-12a601, 72-5462, 74-99b34, 75-2263, 75-6707, 76-7 775, 76-7,107, 79-2959, 79-2964, 79-3425i, 79-34,171 and 79-4804 8 9 and repealing the existing sections. 10 11 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 12 Section 1. 13 (7) For general obligation bonds approved for issuance at an election held on or after July 1, 2017, in determining the amount under subsection 14 15 (b)(2)(D), the state board shall exclude payments for any capital 16 improvement project, or portion thereof, that proposes to construct, 17 reconstruct or remodel a facility that would be used primarily for 18 extracurricular activities, unless the construction, reconstruction or 19 remodeling of such facility is necessary due to concerns relating to the 20 safety of the current facility or disability access to such facility as 21 demonstrated by a state fire marshal report, an inspection under the 22 Americans with disabilities act, 42 U.S.C. § 12101 et seq., or other similar 23 evaluation.

In state fiscal year 2021, the director of 34 accounts and reports shall make transfers in equal amounts on July 15 and 35 January 15 that in the aggregate equal \$913,325 from the state economic 36 development initiatives fund to the state water plan fund. In state fiscal 37 year 2022, the director of accounts and reports shall make transfers in 38 equal amounts on July 15 and January 15 that in the aggregate equal 39 \$1,719,264 from the state economic development initiatives fund to the 40 state water plan fund. In state fiscal year 2023, the director of accounts and reports shall make transfers in equal amounts on July 15 and January 15 41 42 that in the aggregate equal \$500,000 from the state economic development 43 initiatives fund to the state water plan fund. No other moneys credited to

the state economic development initiatives fund shall be used for: (1)
 Water-related projects or programs, or related technical assistance; or (2)
 any other projects or programs, or related technical assistance that meet
 one or more of the long-range goals, objectives and considerations set
 forth in the state water resource planning act.

(b) This subsection shall not apply to the unencumbered balance in
any account of the state institutions building fund that was encumbered for
any fiscal year commencing prior to July 1, 2021.

Sec. 120. Any transfers of moneys during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, from any special revenue fund of any state agency named in this act to the audit services fund of the division of post audit under K.S.A. 46-1121, and amendments thereto, shall be in addition to any expenditure limitation imposed on any such fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023.
