SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE BILL NO. 304

As Recommended by Senate Committee on Judiciary

Brief*

SB 304 would remove the expiration date of May 1, 2021, contained in the COVID-19 Contact Tracing Privacy Act. The bill also would remove an outdated reference to the adoption of rules and regulations to implement the Act.

The bill would be in effect upon publication in the *Kansas Register*.

Background

The bill was introduced by the Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs at the request of Senator Petersen.

Senate Committee on Judiciary

In the Senate Committee hearing on March 26, 2021, written-only **proponent** testimony was provided by representatives of Americans for Prosperity-Kansas and Opportunity Solutions Project.

Written-only **opponent** testimony was provided by representatives of the Kansas Association of Local Health Departments and the Kansas Public Health Association. No other testimony was provided.
