# **Agency Estimate**

The **agency** estimates revised expenditures of \$2.0 million, including \$711,589 SGF, in FY 2022. This is an all funds increase of \$43,178, or 2.3 percent, and an SGF increase of \$43,178, or 6.5 percent, above the agency's FY 2022 approved amount. This increase is primarily due to the agency's supplemental request to fund six months of salary for a new FTE position. The FTE position would be for an information technology (IT) employee. The IT employee would develop remote hearing capabilities to allow the Board to conduct hearings remotely. The new FTE position would be fully funded by SGF moneys.

# **Governor's Recommendation**

The **Governor** recommends revised expenditures of \$2.0 million, including \$711,410 SGF, in FY 2022. This is an SGF decrease of \$179, or less than 0.1 percent, below the agency's revised expenditures in FY 2022. The slight decrease is due to the Governor's recommendation to decrease expenditures on capital outlay by \$3,000, or 34.0 percent, and to increase salaries and wages expenditures by \$2,821, or 0.2 percent, compared to the agency's FY 2022 revised estimate. The Governor recommends approving a modified agency supplemental request. The Governor recommends upgrading the requested FTE position from a Technological Support Consultant II position to an Information Technology Manager position. The Governor has directed the agency to use the new FTE position to conduct an IT needs assessment, in addition to providing dedicated in-house IT support for the agency.
